Adam CP/M Software Info

CP/M opens up an entirely different world to the ADAM user. Since CP/M is common to most computers there are literally tens of thousands of programs available in CP/M format. It is, of course, impossible for us to list them all here. We do, however, have some suggestions to get you going in this area of software. We submit the following bits of info & sources:

1. SOURCE - *Elliam Associates* carries a large catalog of CP/M programs for many different formats including ADAM. If you're serious about CP/M you need to obtain their 41-page catalog which lists thousands of programs. The catalog sells for \$7.50 Each volume listed in Elliam's catalog is \$12.00 They also offer a transfer service to convert CP/M disks to the ADAM format.

2. SOURCE - *SAGE ENTERPRISES* has available "CONVERT" a program written to convert the following formats to the ADAM:

THE ADAM RESOURCE recommends doing the following if you wish to build a strong library of this software:

1. **CONTACT USER GROUPS** = Go through our user group section & check-out the groups that have P.D. packages. Send for their latest listing by sending an SASE. Below we have listed a few major sources but there are others. Many groups are willing to trade to build their library.
2. **USE YOUR MODEM** = A lot of free software is available "ONLINE" Check-out our ONLINE SECTION for sources.
3. **READ BOOKS** = We suggest checking out the books at your local library. There are many books devoted to P.D. Software written in BASIC. Many of these programs will run with little or no changes. Because of the hundreds of requests for information on EVE Electronic Systems products and services, it is impossible to answer all responses individually. Therefore, this is a list of SOME of the commonly asked questions and answers on the EVE line of computer products for the Coloco ADAM Computer. In the near future Eve Electronics will establish a "computer" bulletin board service for question on the products for ADAM, and for placing orders. We will also maintain a mail list for future product announcements and information.

Q. What is the EVE SP-1 ?

A. The EVE SP-1 is an interface for the ADAM Computer to allow the use of printers, plotters, modems, etc. The SP-1 has both a parallel printer port, 'Centronics compatible', and a programmable RS-232C serial port.

Q. What printers can be used with the EVE SP-1 ?

A. Any printer with a 'Centronics standard' parallel interface, or an RS232C interface may be used with the EVE SP-1.

Q. What printers do you suggest ?

A. There are literally hundreds of different printers on the market today, and that number is growing constantly. Virtually any dot matrix, ink-jet, or letter quality printer with either a 'Centronics type' parallel or RS-232C interface will work with the EVE SP-1. The following is a list of a few brands and models which are currently being used by EVE SP-1 owners.

This list is not complete. If you still have a question about another printer let us know, but most serial or parallel printers will work!

Q. What Plotters can be used ?

A. Just as with the printers, if the plotter has a 'Centronics type' parallel or RS-232C serial interface it will operate with the EVE SP-1.

Q. Does the printer or plotter need special software ?

A. The software provided with the EVE SP-1 includes the 'drivers' for both SmartBasic, and CP/M. We also provide a 'patch' for the EOS operating system to allow printouts directly from SmartWriter and SmartFiler.

Q. Can I print files directly from SmartWriter ?

A. Yes, however, due to the unique codes sent to the ADAM printer, some feature will not work properly without a 'Custom Print Program' for the specific printer you have selected. These include 'underlining' and 'super- and sub-scripting'.

Q. What is the 'CUSTOM SmartWriter Print Program'?

A. Because of the unique codes required by each different type of printer to perform such functions as 'super- and sub-scripts', 'italic', compressed, expanded, bold print, etc., a special version of the EOS patch program must be used which has been configured for the particular printer you are using. We feel we should not restrict you to using only a handful of different printers, but rather allow you to select the unit which best suits your needs and budget.

Q. Can I print files from SmartFiler ?

A. With the EOS PATCH now available you can print directly from SmartFiler.

Q. Can I print spreadsheets directly from ADAMCALC ?

A. No. AdamCalc, like several other 'special protected' programs contain their own printer drivers. Since these programs and their associated drivers were designed to 'prevent' modification, there is no way at this time to allow printouts thru the SP-1. Hopefully, with some cooperation from the software writers, this may be possible in the future.

Q. Can I print graphics with my printer and the SP-1 ?

A. If the printer you select has a graphics mode, or a graphics character set, graphics may be used by either 'your' programs, or with several graphics packages available for CP/M. The EVE SP-1 interface and 'driver' software will allow any 8 bit character to be sent to the printer. Therefore if 'your' program sends the proper sequence of commands to your printer, it will be able to print graphics. In addition several SP-1 users are developing programs for such functions as screen dumps in both monochrome and color for specific types of printers.

Q. Does the SP-1 or SS-CC require external power, ie. 120 VAC ?

A. No, the SP-1 and SS-CC are designed for very low power consumption, and therefore are able to derive the power they need from the ADAM system.

Q. Can I do business graphics ?

A. Yes. There are several excellent CP/M business graphics programs available. One example is 'GRAPH-TALK', which supports dozens of different printers. GRAPH-TALK will use your data files or keyboard entry to generate PIE CHARTS, BAR-Graphs, Line graphs in a variety of different formats.

Q. Are these programs available for ADAM's CP/M ?

- A. Yes. Virtually all CP/M 80 software will work on the ADAM CP/M system providing:
- 1 - There is adequate disk space on your ADAM disks.
 - 2 - The screen control codes are or may be configured for ADAM.
 - 3 - The program does not use unalterable 'hardware specific' I/O.

Q. Can I use an 'EXTERNAL' modem with the SP-1 ?

A. Yes. The EVE SP-1 may be used with most RS-232C interface modems, including the 'Smart modems', such as the Hayes, Anchor, etc.. The only other requirement is a properly configured communications program.

Q. What Communications programs may be used ?

A. There are many excellent communications programs which operate under CP/M that can be configured to work with the EVE SP-1. Some of these programs are available in the public domain, and others may be purchased. Some of these include MITE, MITE+, ASCOM, MODEM7, MEX, LINK, etc. The program we recommend is the MITE package by Mycroft Labs. This is a very powerful, versatile, easy to use system which will allow file transfers in ASCII and several binary formats.

Q. Is software available to let ADAM work as a 'remote' computer ?

A. Yes. With the EVE SP-1, the MITE communications package, and an auto-answer modem, the ADAM may be set up for remote use. The Mite package has many special features such as password protection, and user privilege levels. There are also some 885 packages available which may be configured for use with the EVE SP-1.

Q. Can I use MITE with the ADAM Modem also ?

A. Yes. However, because the ADAM modem does not allow for 'auto-answer', the full features

and capabilities of the MITE program may not be used.

Q. What baud rates can I use with the SP-1 ?

A. The SP-1 will operate at any standard baud rate from 50 to 19,200 baud. The configuration program provided will allow easy selection of the more common rates. If another rate is desired, EVE Electronics will provide information on how this is done.

Q. Can I use the SP-1 to communicate with another computer ?

A. Yes. This may be done either with a modem over phone lines, or by direct connection to the other computers RS-232C port. (It may be necessary to use the information in the SP-1 manual to make the proper connections. For further technical information contact EVE Electronics.

Q. Can the SP-1 be used with the Expansion Module #3 ?

A. Yes. All EVE Products may be used with the full system. With the Expansion Module #3, all may be used except the 80 column unit.

Q. What is the 80 column unit ?

A. The EVE YD-MB 80 Column / Mother-board unit will allow full screen display on all 80 columns under the CP/M operating system and SmartBasic as the PR#4 device. This unit will also contain 4 expansion slots for other EVE interfaces, and a power supply for ADAM. The YD-MB will connect to the ADAM console video output and pass output to a 'monochrome' or 'composite' color monitor.

Q. Will the 80 column unit work on a TV ?

A. No. The output of the YD-MB must be connected to a monochrome or good resolution color composite monitor.

Q. Will The 80 column unit work with Expansion Module #3 ?

A. No. The YD-MB requires the composite video signal from the ADAM console to operate properly. If your Expansion unit has been modified to provide composite output, it will work. EVE Electronics will have available a 'kit' to modify the game system to provide the necessary outputs for the YD-MB.

Q. What Software is usable / transferable to ADAM.

A. If you have ADAM CP/M, you can use almost any 'configurable' CP/M-80 program. EVE Electronics offers this transfer service. Contact us for further information.

Q. What is the SS-CC unit ?

A. The EVE SS-CC unit is a Speech synthesizer / real-time clock-calendar interface for the ADAM. It will allow you to create programs to let ADAM 'talk', or you may modify your existing programs. The unit also contains a clock-calendar circuit which may also be used by your programs to allow ADAM to know exactly what time and day it is. The clock-calendar is 'battery backed-up' to retain the time/date information even while ADAM is off for several days or weeks.

Q. Will the Speech synthesizer work in SmartBasic and under CP/M ?

A. Yes. Sample programs and information on the phoneme library are provided with the unit. Other optional speech programs will be offered as they become available.

Q. Can I use the SS-CC and the SP-1 at the same time ?

A. Yes. Eve Electronics offers the MU-2, and MU-3 multi unit cables to allow use of 2 or 3 Eve products simultaneously. Therefore, you can use the MU-2, the SP-1 and the SS-CC. With the MU-3 you can use the SP-1, the SS-CC, and the DC-1 disk controller, when available. Also, the YD-MB 80 column / mother-board unit will allow 4 EVE units to be installed.

Q. What will the 'disk controller' do ?

A. The EVE DC-1 disk controller unit will allow the connection of most commonly available generic disk drives to the ADAM under the CP/M operating system. You will be able to use 3.5", 5.25", and 8" drives, single or double sided, single and double density, with up to 255 tracks. This will give ADAM the capacity for storage of literally 'mega-bytes' of disk storage. This unit will only be supported under CP/M, and will support optional programs to transfer files from several other system disk formats.

Q. What is the ME-64 memory expansion unit ?

A. The EVE ME-64 is a 64 k memory expansion unit which is functionally compatible with the Coloco Memory Expander. This unit plugs in the ADAM memory console, and will be required for some of the software available from EVE Electronics.

Q. Does the ME-64 provide extra memory for SmartBasic ?

A. SmartBasic 1.0 does not support additional 'program' space using the memory expansion unit, however, SmartBasic 2.0 does.

Q. Do you give dealer or club discounts ?

A. EVE Electronics offers dealer discounts for quantity orders of units of the same type. Contact EVE Electronics for further information.

Q. Do you sell games ?

A. No, we primarily handle hardware and CP/M business related software. We do however maintain a list of other dealers who handle 'games'.

Q. Can the SP-1 and SS-CC be plugged into the MON-80 ?

A. No. The MON-80 unlike the YD-MB, does not contain expansion connectors. You may use the MU-2 or MU-3 to utilize more than one EVE product at a time.

Q. Will the MON-80 be able to provide power to ADAM ?

A. No. The MON-80 will not have a power supply for ADAM. You may use the PS-1 for this purpose if desired.

Q. Will the MON-80 have a lite pen input ?

A. No. No provision for lite pen is provided on the MON-80.

Q. Will my PS-1 be obsolete when I get the YD-MB ?

A. The YD-MB contains a power source for ADAM. If you already have the PS-1 we will allow a trade-in allowance based on age and condition of your PS-1.

Q. Will it be difficult to remove the SP-1 & SS-CC units from their boxes.

A. The YD-MB will provide the detailed instructions for removal of the EVE stand-alone units such as the SS-CC and SP-1. For those units which require them, special connector brackets will be provided.

Q. Where may the YD-MB be placed when connected to ADAM ?

A. The YD-MB has been designed to be placed either directly on top of, or to the right of the Memory Console, and plugs into the Expansion port.

Q. Are programs available from other EVE product users ?

A. Yes. We encourage the development of software for use with EVE products, and will provide all information possible. If you have written any software for EVE products, please send it to us for review, and listing in our catalogs.

Q. Where can I get Public Domain CP/M software ?

A. Public domain software is available from many sources, including CompuServe, remote BBS systems, local Computer Societies, etc. In the future, EVE Electronics will have available a library of such public domain software.

THE CARE & FEEDING OF ADAM

How to effectively maintain your ADAM Computer System

THERE ARE A NUMBER OF THINGS YOU CAN DO FOR YOUR ADAM TO HELP KEEP IT HEALTHY AND LIVE A LONG LIFE. WHILE AT RARE TIMES, YOUR ADAM MAY NEED SERVICING BY A PROFESSIONAL, THE MAJORITY OF THE TIME YOU CAN PERFORM PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE, THUS KEEPING ADAM OFF THE SICK LIST !

HERE ARE A FEW SUGGESTIONS WE HAVE TO HELP KEEP ADAM UP & RUNNING:

1. KEEP HIM CLEAN - It's very important to keep any computer clean. Dust & dirt is a major enemy. When not in use, keep ADAM covered. There are a number of covers available, or if you have a seamstress in the family, have her make one for you. Periodically use a "dust blower" on ADAM. These come in aerosol cans & are relatively inexpensive. Once in awhile you should clean the heads on your data drive(s). Cleaning kits are available for this. (This is done very similar to cleaning a normal cassette recorder.) If you use high-quality data-packs, your heads will not need cleaning often. It all depends on what & how much you use. Disk drives need to be periodically cleaned as well. (See our special notes on Floppies & Disk drives in this section.) Always wipe ADAM off with a soft dry cloth. NEVER pour water on him! He gets so mad that he sizzles...& he may get mad enough to sizzle you, too!

2. USE A SURGE PROTECTOR - Almost every household has experienced variance in their electric. Sometimes the lights dim or brighten for a few seconds. These surges can be caused by lightning, or other electrical appliances such as a refrigerator or air-conditioner. Spend a few dollars (aprox. \$15) to protect you ADAM from electrical surges. They can do permanant damage!

3. ANTI-STATIC PRODUCTS - Sometimes static electricity can ZAP away your info by erasing a data pack or disk. If you have static problems in your home (most do in the winter time) it may be a good idea to invest in a couple of anti-static products. These consist of sprays, mats, & touch pads which are available at most computer shops.

4. FANNING ADAM - The power supply in ADAM's printer gets very hot when used for long periods of time. There are a number of small computer fans available to help solve this problem. It's also possible to pick-up an additional power supply unit allowing you to program and not have the ADAM printer on, thus saving the life of your ADAM power supply in the printer.

5. WHEN SOMETHING GOES WRONG - If something doesn't seem to be working right, we suggest the following: 1st) Refer to the **Adam System Check-out & Troubleshooting Guide**. This is a several page manual that should have come with your ADAM. Follow its instructions & 75% of the time, you'll find the problem. If there's still a problem, 2nd) Contact a friend with an ADAM & see if you can find the problem area together. Sometimes you can isolate a problem by switching ADAM components to see if it will function after the switch. This is simply a process of elimination. If you feel like there is still a serious problem, then 3rd) Contact your nearest Honeywell Service Center. (All the current Honeywell Centers are listed in this section.) A Word About DataPacks...

DATA PACKS - Treat data packs with respect & you'll get a lot of use out of them. Never touch the tape. Keep from getting hot. Purchase some type of regular cassette storage case to store your data packs in. Keeping them safe is most important. Do not place them close to magnetic or electrical appliances that might emit magnetic waves. This can seriously damage your data pack. Always carefully insert them in the drive. If you have to force it in, then it's not in there right. Remove it and do it again. If you don't take the time to do this, you'll end up possibly damaging your datapack and end up with an IO ERROR & have to start all over again. Be sure to make back-ups of all your important programs. This is much easier with a second drive unit. (Drive units are easily available at reduced prices.)

DISK DRIVES & FLOPPIES...



Take Care of Floppies

You will run into all kinds of warnings about how sensitive your floppy disks are to damage. The more you take these warnings to heart, the better. Here's a summary of floppy disk no-nos.

- Never touch the disk surface through the access hole—the elliptically shaped opening in the disk's cover where the actual reading and writing are done.
- Don't expose the disks to excessive heat or cold or to a magnetic field. Motors, telephones, and all sorts of other electrical devices—including your computer's power supply—generate magnetic fields.
- Don't write on your disks, paper-clip them, or otherwise gouge them. If you do, you'll physically damage the disk and, along with it, whatever programs or data were located there.
- Don't leave disks lying around—you are inviting trouble. They'll get dirty, crushed, or knocked onto the floor. They belong in their jackets, stored upright in a container that will keep dust from getting to them.
- Always maintain backup copies of programs and data. No matter how careful you are, something always seems to go wrong with a floppy—usually the one you forgot to back up.



We'll Drink to That

Accidents happen, and chances are that someday you'll spill something on your computer or disks. It may seem relatively harmless—a glass of water, perhaps—but it can damage your equipment in a big way.

You probably already know that water and electricity don't mix, so the first thing you must worry about when you spill something on your computer is the potential for electric shock. Your first action (after you make sure that whatever you spilled has stopped running into your computer) is to unplug everything.

The severity of the incident depends partly on what and how much was spilled. The worst problems come with liquids containing acids—most soft drinks, for example. The carbonic acid in a soft drink is mild, to be sure, but it will do a real number on the metal in your machine. The next biggest problem is with drinks containing sugar. After the liquid dries, the sugar remains, leaving a sticky, scratchy mess that can really foul things up.

Many computer components are hardy enough to withstand a quick dunking. If the liquid spilled was water—even hot water in the form of coffee or tea with no cream or sugar—you can get by with blotting up what liquids you can see, then blowing it dry with a hair dryer or a vacuum cleaner in reverse. Worry a bit about overheating your components with the hair dryer, but getting it dry quickly is more important.

If you spilled a soft drink or some other sticky liquid, you've got to get it off. Probably the safest approach is to try cleaning it with electrical-contact/relay cleaner, although it's rather expensive and may not give you enough liquid to wash things off thoroughly. Another approach is to literally bathe the board with isopropyl (rubbing) alcohol. Be sure it's straight alcohol—no sweet-smelling additives are needed by your computer. Be careful—it's flammable. But it dries quickly and shouldn't cause any real problems. And it's cheaper than electrical contact cleaner and probably more effective.

Disk drives are another problem. If one got drenched, you probably should have it professionally cleaned, lubricated, and realigned. Foreign matter that gets into the drive could cause it to scratch disks.

If you got disks wet, you're probably better off tossing them out and hoping that you've got backup copies. You can try wiping them off, but if moisture or other foreign matter remains, you run the risk of ruining a disk drive when you insert the soiled disk into your machine. If the disks got by with only a sprinkling, let them dry thoroughly (the lining in which disks are housed is absorbent, so let it dry overnight), then try reading one file. If you're successful, copy all the files from one disk to another and throw away the original.

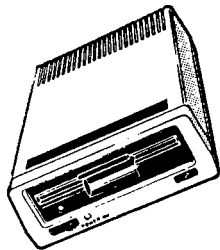

Don't Shake Your Head

When you move your computer from one place to another, there's a chance the drive's read/write head can become damaged from bouncing up and down. To avoid such problems, use a "head protection spacer" whenever you move. You can make one easily by cutting a piece of thin cardboard into the shape of a floppy disk. Or use a disk you no longer need.

Behind Closed Doors

If you have single-sided disk drives, keep the disk drive door closed when they're not in use to guard against dust, which can destroy the read/write head. But don't do this if you have double-sided drives. If you shut the door without a disk inserted, the two read/write heads will press together, possibly damaging them. Instead, place a disk you no longer need into the drive, leaving it there with the door shut when the drive is not in use. This will protect the read/write heads from dust and from each other.

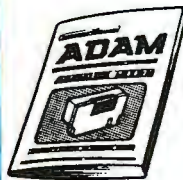

2. HOURS OF OPERATION

MOST BOARDS OPERATE 24 HOURS SO IT'S OK TO CALL ANYTIME. IF THE BOARD DOES NOT OPERATE 24-HOURS, YOU PROBABLY SHOULD NOT CALL THE BOARD ANY EARLIER THAN 8:00 PM IN ITS LOCAL TIME-ZONE. 8:00 PM WOULD BE EVEN SAFER.

3. OFF THE AIR:

IF A BOARD DOES NOT ANSWER AFTER TWO OR THREE RINGS, IT IS FOR SOME REASON OUT OF COMMISSION, POSSIBLY FOR GOOD OR FOR REPAIRS. HANG-UP AFTER 2-3 RINGS. MANY LONG-DISTANCE SERVICES NOW CHARGE YOU FOR A CALL EVEN IF IT IS NOT ANSWERED AFTER THREE RINGS. HANG-UP & SAVE MONEY!

4. WHO CAN YOU TALK TO?

YOU CAN TALK TO ANY BOARD USING YOUR ADAM. YOU SIMPLY NEED TO MAKE THE PROPER SETTINGS AND FOLLOW PROPER LOG-ON PROCEDURES FOR THAT PARTICULAR BOARD. IT IS ADVISED TO DOWNLOAD THE INSTRUCTIONS OFFERED WHEN YOU FIRST LOG-ON TO A SYSTEM. THAT WAY YOU WILL HAVE ALL THE INFO AT YOUR FINGERTIPS FOR FUTURE REFERENCE. REMEMBER...IF YOU ARE CONSTANTLY CALLING FOR THE "HELP" FILE YOU'RE GOING TO TAKE A LOT OF TIME AS WELL AS MONEY OUT OF YOUR POCKET.

5. BE CONSIDERATE

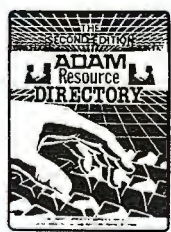

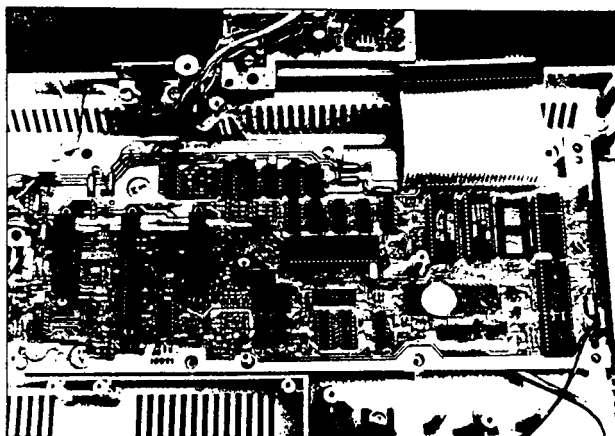

THE ADAM KIT

HOW TO BUILD YOUR OWN ADAM FROM COMPONENTS

The advertisement said Coleco Adam Computer, complete, less printer and cabinet. Build your own Adam computer from components, for \$99.95.

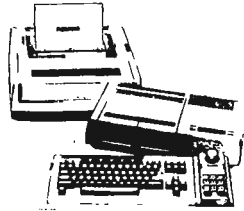
It sounded good, and I am mechanically inclined, so I ordered one. Eight weeks later I received the following; One power supply, One each of the two component boards, One keyboard, Two data drives, Two game controllers, and One Buck Rogers game tape.

As the ad had claimed, it was all there, and could easily be plugged together to form a working computer. No soldering was required, and all the receptacles, toggle switches, etc. were present. However it would have to be put in something to protect and contain it. Checking the local Radio Shack, and other Electronics stores I found no container large enough for the job. I resorted to using whatever was at hand. I used a flat oak board as a base, and glued small wood blocks to this to provide the two tiered base for the component boards. I also glued small blocks to attach the toggle switches, and other ports. I screwed the boards in place with wood screws, with foam pads between the boards and the wood blocks. I then made the sides and top out of plexiglass. Several vent and access holes had to be made through the plexiglass, and this is not an easy job. I left one corner open to install one data drive. I only used one to keep the container as small as possible.

I now have a working Adam computer that is about two thirds as large as the original, and can look right inside to see the components. By using my Eve interface I can use any dot matrix printer to complete the package. It is not fancy, though yours could be, but it is rugged and it works.

A few things need to be explained. The first time I hooked up the power supply the electronic typewriter screen appeared and nothing would work. I traced this down to the fact that the power supply is actually the bottom portion of the printer. There usually though not always are additional electronic components from the printer on this board. Since the rest of the printer is not connected it won't function properly. I have seen in some publications a kit with a switch and wiring diagrams to get around this problem. There is a much simpler way to do this. Just disconnect the white plastic, four prong, slide connector connecting the transformer board to the other components. Also make sure that any peripheral units such as disc drives or printers are turned on before the power supply. This minor inconvenience allows for normal use of the power supply. The container I used is not shielded and this can cause serious interference with a regular TV. No interference is noticed on a monitor, just on a TV. Also when I Tried to use a roller controller with this unit my remote control TV located at the other end of the house went crazy. It turned on then off then on again, channels changed etc. Proper shielding would eliminate this. The wiring diagram provided with the kit did not describe what to do with the braided ground wire hanging from the edge of one board. I connected it to a similar position on the other board assuming this would ground the whole rig.

All in all I am real pleased with the results of this package. It is a working Adam in a smaller package. I am going to assemble another without installing a data drive to use just with my disc drives allowing for a very small container. By the way this article was written on my home built Adam home computer.



NEW ADAM OWNERS WORKSHOP COURTESY OF NIAD USER GROUP

The purpose of this column is to help new ADAM owners get started and effectively use their system.

Obviously, some of you new ADAM owners may be computer experts in that you may have had other systems and only need acclimation to the specifics of the ADAM. The rest of you may have purchased the ADAM as their first computer system.

The first thing to stress is READ the instructions and manuals supplied with your ADAM. Many questions I have answered could have been solved through reading the Coleco manuals. Now, I know that this is tough for the impetuous among us (I am one of these types), but it necessary if you want to effectively use your system. I do recommend a training course that will help you get started with your ADAM called the Learning Express. This audio course was reviewed in NIAD issue # 10 and is a great way to get started, especially if you are a new computer owner. The audio tape and manual does a nice job of stepping the novice through setting up the computer, and using both SMARTWriter and SMARTBasic. Depending on what you plan to use your ADAM for will determine what education you need. If you just plan to use the wordprocessing program (SMARTWriter) then a combination of the book supplied with ADAM and one called

The Second Book of ADAM: Using SMARTWriter.

For you potential Basic programmers, you need to plan on spending some time to learn the Basic programming language. There are a lot of Basic programming books around and two that are good for the beginner are: The Coleco ADAM User's Handbook and The First Book of ADAM.

Another good book on ADAM SMARTBasic is The Basic ADAM: A Self Teaching Guide. This book is good for both the beginner, due to its approach to explanations and many examples and for the person who wants advanced programming techniques in areas such as graphics. Now if you want to get into other languages such as LOGO or use programs such as ADAMCalc or SMARTfiler you will have to study the manuals that come with these programs. I would suggest you get the back issues of NIAD to read the reviews and workshops on some of these programs.

CPM is a whole other world and I would suggest you get acquainted with the ADAM for awhile before you tackle CPM. See the CPM WORKSHOPS in the various issues for information on this operating system and associated programs.

These are some basics you need to get started.

1. The first is a "backup copy" utility that will allow you to create a second copy of important programs such as your SMARTBasic tape and other key programs. This is a commandment to insure that you have an extra copy of these key programs in case your original is lost or damaged. If you do not have one of these programs (there are a bunch on the market) you should order the NIAD Public Domain Volume UTILITY # UNDMV1 which contains a program called UTILICOPY which will make back up copies of all your data packs and disks except for the SUPERgames. This is the only tape/disk backup program in the Public Domain that we are aware of. Hardware repair for your ADAM (except for the Disk Drive) can be obtained at a Honeywell Service center located near you - call information or the Coleco toll free "Hotline" for the phone number of the nearest Honeywell Service center.

3. Read reviews of software and hardware products to determine which products you are interested in. Don't buy indiscriminately just because a title sounds good because you may be disappointed and frustrated.

4. Order basic supplies of ribbons and extra data packs/diskettes so you don't run out when you're in the middle of a hot project.

BEGINNER'S BASIC WORKSHOP COURTESY OF NIAD USER GROUP

To get a catalog listing

CATALOG (optional Bn)

i.e. CATALOG catalog from last drive used --ddp/disk CATALOG

D1 catalog from tape drive 1

CATALOG B5 catalog from disk drive 1

If you do not have a tape/disk in the requested drive, the system seems to lock up. Simply put a tape/disk in the drive and the catalog command is processed. Listed on the screen is the catalog listing showing the contents (files) on the tape/disk.

To get a program listing,

LIST (optional start line #, opt. end line #)

This displays, on the screen, the current program in memory (or portion of that program).

i.e. LIST lists all lines

LIST 10 lists line 10 only

LIST 10,100 lists line 10 thru 100

LIST 10, lists line 10 thru last line

LIST ,100 lists first line thru line 100

As we said, these normally go to the T.V. screen. The speed at which they are displayed is normally very fast. Long lists/catalogs scroll off the top of the screen before we can read them. Let's take a look at how we can handle these situations.

CHANGING Screen to Printer

PR#1 directs all future output to ALSO go to the ADAM printer. Output can be from list, catalog, or normal print.

PR#0 Shuts printer output off. Output only goes to screen.

These commands can be either part of a BASIC program or typed in directly. Once you PR#1, the printer is on (output goes there) until you PR#0. One other thing does it. If in the middle of printer output, you do a Control/C, this will

interrupt the listing AND discontinue output to printer (as if you did PR#0). To restart, redo PR#1. It is normal to here the print carriage go back to the left when you do

PR#1. EXAMPLE

PR#1 : set on printer output

CATALOG: catalog list from current drive

output to screen AND printer

PR#0 : shut off printer output

If you already have text output on the screen and wish to

print it, hit CONTROL/P (hold control key and the P or p).

This will print all text information currently on the

screen. It WILL NOT print HI-res, LO-res graphics or

INVERSE text information.

Suppose you simply wish to slow down the display (screen)

speed at which the information is listed. The SPEED=n

command will do this. Again, either make it part of a BASIC

program or type it in directly. This controls screen

display speed, NOT printer speed.

i.e. SPEED=255 fastest speed

SPEED=0 slowest speed

SPEED=any value 0-255

Once set, the speed stays set until you change it.

SAMPLE PROGRAM

10 HOME:PRINT " ENTER SPEED 0 - 255"

20 PRINT " or other value to end"

30 INPUT " SPEED ";S

40 IF S < 0 OR S > 255 THEN SPEED=255:END

50 SPEED=S

60 PRINT " This is a sample"

70 PRINT " of SPEED ";S

80 PRINT " try a different value to judge"

90 GOTO 10

Run it to see the relative speeds. Just type in a numerical

speed value of 0 to 255. To END, enter a numeric value

other than 0 - 255 (ie 256).

The last thing we want to control is stop screen scrolling.

Actually, what we want to do is PAUSE the display (not

interrupt it as with Control/C). To do this, we do a

Control/B (hold control key and S or s) to pause the

output. To continue, hit any key (or just hit return). The

output (screen or printed) will restart where it left off.

Try it when running the sample program.

I hope this helps some of our new computer users out or

makes the reference manual information on this a little clearer.

Try These...



To make it easier to proof and update your Smartwriter files try this adjustment to your screen. Change the screen options to moving window format. Then set the margins to 10 and 42. This keeps all the text on the same screen, and allows for moving the cursor anywhere to edit at will.

Did you Know...



ADAM's printer was manufactured in Northern Ireland.

ADAM's operating system was developed by InfoSoft, and is labeled I/OS

To go to whatever screen you want to practice on Miner 2049er when the game asks for the number of players you enter 6453# followed by the screen number. * corresponds to screen 10 and # equals screen 11.

That if you have a disc drive you must turn it on first for ADAM to recognize that it's on line.

That if you poke 17529,00 the cursor will disappear from the screen, and poke 17529,66 brings it back. Poking in the ASCII number of any character will work similarly.

That by pressing CONTROL + [in the typewriter mode will take you to Smartwriter.

Your ADAM disc drive was manufactured by M.P.I. (Micro Peripherals, Inc.)

When installing a second data drive to be very careful to get these connected correctly. They can be installed one pin to either side. Failure to do this may destroy one or more of your components including the CPU.

Lightning is a terribly powerful static discharge. So called surge suppressors, spike protectors, and voltage regulators are worthless against a direct or near direct strike. Even unplugging may not protect you since lightning can jump from point to point, though this is the only resort we have. Also don't forget that your discs, and data packs can be damaged by being in proximity to the static path, and should be stored away from any danger, this includes the area around all the wires and metal around your computer work station.

To get rid of those pesky spaces that appear in REM and DATA statements each time you save or resave the program, place the cursor on the start of the line number, using the right arrow key move to one space past the line number. Next hold down the CONTROL key while moving over the offending spaces, when you have the cursor under the first character of your line let up the CONTROL key and move the cursor using only the arrow key past the end of the line and hit RETURN.

Sometimes placing aluminum foil under a TV being used as a monitor will reduce interference.

Wrapping unused monitor cable in loose loops with a plastic trash fastener, or around a cardboard tube left from handtowels will sometimes reduce ghosting on your TV.

You may be able to get a blank line while using Smartwriter without the extra half line it automatically inserts, by doing the following in the first space of the line to be left blank. Hit the SUPER/SUBSCRIPT key, then hit the SUBSCRIPT key, then enter a space, hit the DONE key, and then hit RETURN. This should work.

Smartbasic does not allow for recovering H type files. By poking address 20619 with 72 will allow you to recover them.

To initialize a disc from smartbasic allowing for volume naming without the bug of 255 blocks being registered poke address 25305 with 160. This will show the correct number of blocks, and allows you to name the volume.

If you have ever been working on an extremely long smartbasic program, and wasn't able to save it due to an "OUT OF MEMORY" error message, don't give up. Some of your memory has been tied up by your manipulating your program lines. Try deleting five to ten lines at the end of the program until you free enough memory for you to save the program. Now reload the program and type back the deleted lines, nine times out of ten the program will save after this procedure.

Tips

Using Coleco Software with the Eve SPI Interface...

Checking YOUR Version...

To check your version of CPU, while in the electronic typewriter mode press CONTROL + R. look at the smartkey display at the bottom of the screen and you will see an "R" followed by a number. If your number is under R79 is has bugs in it and should be taken to honeywell for an updated version.

To check the revision number of Smartbasic, then type PRINT PEEK (260) then press RETURN. A number will appear. If its 79 or above it's OK. If it's under 79 get it replaced because it's an old version. (Some programs available will not run with the old version).

To check your revision of Disk Manager (D.O.S.), press CONTROL + R just after booting. The number 15 seems to be a good version.

To check your revision of SmartFiler, press CONTROL + R just after booting. Revision 27D is the only version that seems to operate adequately, though it seems to have some problems in the search mode. N-I-A-D. has a copy service to update your version that also takes care of the half space problem when printing.

To check your revision of AdamLink II, press CONTROL + R just after booting. Revision 12 is the newest one.

Randomize Numbers...

RANDOMIZE NUMBERS: SmartBasic's RND function returns a random real number less than 1 and greater than or equal to zero. The sequence of random numbers is the same each time Smart Basic is booted, and each time you RUN a program. This arrangement is consistent with ANSI standards, but it differs from AppleSoft™ Basic which produces a new random number each time the program runs.

Here is a little program that will randomize the numbers each time you start the program. The randomization is based on the variable length of time it takes a person to press a number on the front Paddle's keypad that is requested in the first line. ADAM strobes the keypad to see if any number has been pressed. If it was not pressed, ADAM decrements counter rx. Since it is very unlikely that people will press the keypad's number keys in the same length of time, a random seed (negative number) is produced.

Here is a program that can be tacked into the first 3 lines of your program:

```
1 PRINT "Press # on the front  
keypad to continue"  
2 rx = rx - 1 : IF NOT PDL(11) THEN  
3 junk = RND(rx)
```

If you want to use this in a little test program that shows a bunch of random numbers between 1 and 6, type in lines 1 through 3, then add:

```
10 FOR Y = 1 TO 5  
20   FOR X = 1 TO 10  
30     PRINT INT(RND(1)*6+1); " ";  
40 NEXT X : PRINT : NEXT Y
```

You may wish to have a truly randomized number to start your program the first time, but start from the same number each time thereafter. If so, have your program loop back to line 3.

Eve Electronics Systems has been shipping with their SPI interface a patch to allow direct printing with Smartwriter. This patch you implement yourself onto a copy of your disk manager. There after by booting this patched disc manager then pushing the EXCAPE/WP key twice you can print directly from Smartwriter. This patch can also be used to run most other software using the regular print drivers, or pri commands.

By pressing smart key V FILE OPTIONS, then IV RUN, and then VI RUN FILE you can run Smart Basic, Smart Filer, and nearly all of the Coleco software except the Super Game Packs. This is a lot simpler then running a separate program under Smart Basic, then using pr2 commands, and makes nearly all of the Coleco software available to your new printer easily.

Beside the Super Game Packs there are a few programs that give special problems. You cannot get Smart Letters and Forms to print directly, but you can save your letter or form to disc or datapack, then print it over the interface using Smart Writer. You cannot print out the practice drills to paper off EXPERTYPE since it uses its own print drivers. The other piece, ADAMCalc will not print directly, also because it uses its own print drivers not handled by the Eve patch. You can by using the STORE VALUES instead of the STORE SHEET command from ADAMCalc put a file on your disc, or datapack that can be accessed by Smartwriter, and printed through the SPI interface and high speed printer.

This version is not the same format as from ADAMCalc. If you have a spreadsheet more then 60 characters wide it shifts the right half one line down then compresses the form to 60 characters. It will print all the information, and is readable though not as nice as the ADAMCalc version. The ADAMCalc manual discusses this option on page 35, and describes it as a way to include spreadsheet information in a smartwriter report, etc. You can by deleting first the left part, and storing, then the right half and storing, come up with a good looking, easily read two part sheet.

As with many of the other programs people are now trying to get around these print driver problems and there may even be an easier way to handle these problems in the near future

Closing Data Files...

CLOSING DATA FILES: If you have worked with Sequential or Random Access files, you may have noticed an intermittent problem when ADAM was attempting to read data and close the file. The result was either an END OF DATA ERROR, or garbage appearing in your files.

The problem is caused by a safety feature built into SmartBasic. As with AppleSoft, SmartBasic uses PRINT CHR\$(4) as a signal to ADAM to change the I/O message to the Data Drives. But CHR\$(4) also can be used to print a heart on the screen. To help ADAM distinguish which signal is being used, PRINT CHR\$(4) is only interpreted as an I/O signal when the instruction begins in the left margin of the screen, directly after the line numbers, or after a carriage return.

Your program is often written so that the statement immediately preceding the file closing places the cursor somewhere on the screen other than the left margin. (A NEXT, or a MOV,C,O,L will do this.) As a result, a heart followed by a "close..." statement appears on the screen, followed by the END OF DATA error message.

This problem can be corrected by adding an HTAB 1 to the beginning of the Close File line.

```
160 HTAB 1 : PRINT D$; "close myfile"
```

The Question Marks: When ADAM reads a data file, it prints the question mark each time it looks for an input, resulting in as many question marks as you have data items. If you find this aggravating, you can erase the question mark by adding to the INPUT line:

```
140 INPUT add$(x) : PRINT CHR$(8);
```

This causes the cursor to backspace over the question mark and rub it out each time it is printed.

These modifications are written into a sequential file program on Page 2.

An example of a Sequential File with 10 items.

Writing the File out to the Disk. The fix is on line 150.

A Program to read the file. The fixes are on lines 140 and 160.

```

140 INPUT stuff$(x) : PRINT CHR$(8);

If you wish to print the contents of the file on the printer, turn the printer on after line 170. Otherwise, the printer will print the messages that go out to the data drive, and all of the question marks.

Really Clean-up your Datapacks...

REALLY DELETING FILES
WHEN YOU DELETE FILES IN SMARTBASIC, IT ACTUALLY ONLY ERASES THE FILE NAME FROM THE TAPE OR DISK. TO ACTUALLY CLEAN-UP THE TAPE, RUN THE FOLLOWING PROGRAM.

```
10 D$=CHR$(4)
20 ? D$;"OPEN<FILENAME>"
30 ? D$;"WRITE<FILENAME>"
40 ?
50 ? D$;"CLOSE<FILENAME>"
```

AFTER THIS PROGRAM RUNS, TYPE IN "DELETE <FILENAME>" AND HIT RETURN.

Alignment of Columns...

Zones: If you wish to have variables printed in columns on the screen or printer, the convention used in BASIC is a comma, printed just after the variable.

Try this program:

```
10 FOR X = 1 TO 20
20 PRINT X,
30 NEXT X
```

On the ADAM, this prints on the screen in two zones that are 15 columns apart, with the first zone offset to the second column.

It looks like this:

```
1 2
3 4
5 6
7 8
9 10
11 12
etc.....
```

But why is that 1 not in the column? Unfortunately, the comma that tells ADAM that the numbers are to be arranged in Zones is not read until after ADAM has received the command to print 1, so it is printed out of place.

To fix the columns so that they are in line, insert this line:

```
5 PRINT TAB(2)
```

This causes ADAM to position the cursor in the second column, and when the order is given to print the loop of numbers, the cursor is in the right place to begin.

ZONES ON THE PRINTER: The printer is not programmed to provide zones. It will dutifully print each number 15 or 16 spaces apart, but this produces an unpleasant arrangement on the page (which is 80 columns instead of the 31 columns provided on the SmartBasic screen.)

Here is one way to get the printer to print your data in five even zones:

```
5 PRINT : PRINT TAB(2)
10 FOR X = 1 TO 20
20 PRINT X,
30 IF INT(X/5) = X/5 THEN PRINT : PRINT
TAB(2)
40 NEXT X
```

It is necessary to issue two print statements in line 5. The first statement takes the printer off of the line on which it placed the Basic Bracket. That bracket throws the printer off by one space. Line 20 throws in a Carriage Return after the fifth zone.

When using SmartBASIC and you have Instructions/Text on the TV screen it is distracting to see some words that are started on one line and continue on the next line. This pyramid will help you to choose the correct H Tab to center each Line/Paragraph. Do not exceed 30 Characters per line.

The maximum number of Text lines that can be on the TV screen while in SmartBASIC is 24. This includes any spaces between paragraphs. VTAB 1 is printed on the first line while VTAB 24 will print on the last line (24). Use the VTAB first followed by the HTAB #. Example: 10 VTAB 6: HTAB 2: PRINT "Modified by Norman R. Castro" This will be on the 6th line and indented one space.

TIPS

Your Text Window...

SETTING THE SIZE OF THE TEXT WINDOW: If your television screen seems too small for SmartBasic (because characters disappear off the left or right edge), or if you want to have your text appear in a "Window" on one section of the screen, here is a program that will help.

The program peeks into Basic and finds four important memory addresses. It is written to list these locations on your printer:

Explanation: Text displayed on ADAM'S screen is actually a map of a portion of ADAM'S memory. What you see on the screen is simply copied from that section of memory. The boundaries of the memory section are set by ADAM to 31 columns by 24 rows. You change the size of this "window" by changing numbers in the 4 memory locations. **Caution:** While it is possible to put any number (0 to 255) in these locations, you can create a situation in which ADAM is not putting characters on the screen, or one in which ADAM has no place in memory to place screen information. If you do this, you will get unsatisfactory results, and likely wind up re-booting BASIC. When you RUN the program, it will display the current value stored in each location. This value is called the DEFAULT value (the number stored in that location when BASIC is booted.)

Number of lines on your screen. ADAM'S Address: _____
(Apple's PEEK 35) The default value is 23.
To change the number of lines, POKE a number (between 3 and 23) into the "Lines Address" that you obtained when you ran the program.

POKE (address), number : TEXT

After you POKE this location, it is necessary to enter the TEXT command. ADAM only looks at the margin addresses when BASIC is first booted up, and after the TEXT command, so you must enter TEXT after changing the dimensions of your window.

Number of columns. ADAM'S Address: _____
(Apple's PEEK 33) Default is 30. To make the screen one column narrower, change this to a value of 29.
The number of columns is added to the left margin. If your left margin is set at 2, a setting of 28 columns will take the cursor over to the 30th column on the screen.
CAUTION: If you use the CONTROL-N function to insert characters on a line, and the end of the line spills past the right margin of the screen, the text that was pushed off of the screen will be ignored by ADAM.

WATCH TO SEE WHEN YOU ARE TYPING DIRECTLY UNDERNEATH THE QUOTATION MARK OF THE PREVIOUS LINE. 4. IF THE WORD YOU ARE TYPING DOES NOT END BEFORE REACHING THE POINT DIRECTLY UNDER THE QUOTATION MARK, YOU NEED TO SKIP ENOUGH SPACES TO START PRINTING YOUR NEXT WORD IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE SPACE UNDER THE " MARK.

Reusing Printer Ribbons...

PRINTER RIBBONS & REUSE/REWINDING

This modified ADAM printer ribbon case will enable you to rewind other ribbons and place them back into their former ribbon cases for reuse. Or you could use this modified ribbon case immediately after rewinding by inserting the Ribbon advance knob, pivot arm & the rubber ring. **NOTE** if this is not done correctly the ribbon will NOT advance properly and your printed sheet will be extremely light in print.

You will need the following tools:

1. A small thin blade screwdriver
2. A clean putty knife
3. A flat 1/8" punch
4. An Xacto hammer with the steel head
5. A variable speed (preferred) electric drill
6. A 3/8" Brad point wood drill bit with cutting flutes
7. A hobby type small electric drill with a 1/4" circular blade
8. Pine sandpaper

A. Remove the small rubber ring & set aside. **NOTE:** Before removing any parts read over all of the instructions to acquaint yourself so that you will be able to replace each part correctly.

B. Use the small thin blade screwdriver to pry open the top of the ribbon case. Take your time as there are 6 plastic pins that are part of the top cover that have to be coaxed open (pried apart) from the bottom. Use the putty knife to help keep this case apart while working your way around the case. Set the top of the case aside.

C. Remove the 1" pivot arm by lifting it straight up along with the Ribbon Advance Knob & set both aside.

D. Remove the empty supply spool on the right by lifting straight up. Leave the end of the ribbon attached & set aside.

E. Take the clean putty knife & insert it carefully under the take-up spool of the used ribbon & core. Move this as one unit & set aside.

F. To remove the 2-1/2" thin round plastic disk that the used ribbon was on top of, turn over the ribbon case & tap it out & set aside.

G. Use the small hobby drill (Dressel Moto-Tool type) with the 1/4" blade & remove the 3/8" plastic stud that held the fresh supply of ribbon on the right side. Cut flush to the ribbon case & sand slightly to remove burrs etc. Clean the bottom of the ribbon case & wipe with a clean rag. Set aside.

H. Take the ribbon case top and use the 1/8" flat punch on the INSIDE, where the fresh ribbon was & flatten the center dimple so that the Brad point wood drill bit won't slip.

I. Drill a 3/8" hole where that dimple was using the Brad point wood bit. You'll end up with a hole on the top of the ribbon case that will now enable you to insert a 3/8" dowel (around 8" long) into the right spool core to rewind the used ribbon on.

J. Replace the 2-1/2" thin round plastic disk on the left.

K. Replace the full used ribbon with the core intact back on the round plastic disk (use the clean putty knife). Take the empty core with the ribbon attached & put it back in the bottom right of the ribbon case.

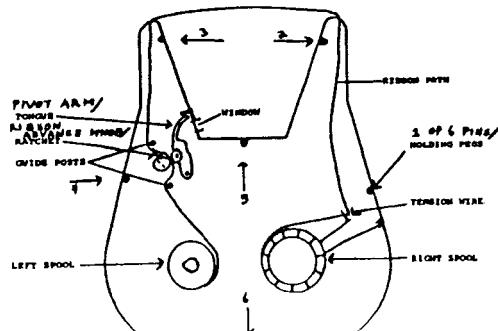
L. Do NOT replace the Ribbon Advance Knob (Ratchet) OR the 1" pivot arm (Tongue). Thread the ribbon back on the empty core by-passing the tension wire and put the ribbon case cover back on & PRESS carefully at the 6 plastic pins (Pegs) to close this tightly. This is to insure that the ribbon will rewind evenly and not be lumpy.

M. Insert the 3/8" wood dowel in carefully as far as it go and begin to rewind COUNTER Clock Wise until finished. Do not hurry your almost finished.

N. When the rewinding is finished carefully take out the re-wound supply ribbon & empty core from the left & transfer this to the original ribbon case on the right side (supply spool). Don't forget to install the Ribbon Advance Knob (Ratchet) and the 1" pivot arm (Tongue) back in. Retread the ribbon as shown & don't forget the tension wire.

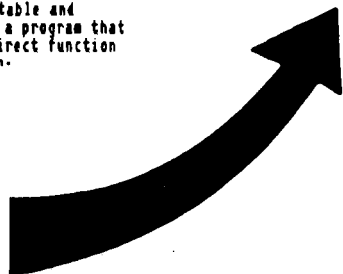
COLECO NEVER DID RELEASE (AT LEAST OFFICIALLY) SMARTBASIC II. HOWEVER, A GROWING NUMBER OF PEOPLE ACROSS THE COUNTRY ARE OBTAINING COPIES OF IT FROM FRIENDS, USER GROUPS, ETC.. NOBODY'S REALLY SURE WHERE IT ORIGINALLY CAME FROM, BUT IT APPARENTLY IT WAS "BRIEF-CASED" OUT OF COLECO. SINCE THERE IS A GROWING INTEREST IN THIS, WE HAVE INCLUDED A FEW FACTS WE HAVE OBTAINED ABOUT SMARTBASIC II. AS TO OBTAINING YOUR OWN COPY, YOU'LL NEED TO ASK AROUND!

WELL...HERE'S A FEW SMARTBASIC II.....

- 1) The 64K expander is accessed in a "bank-switch" configuration..To switch to the Memory Expander, then command is EXTME, and the command to switch back is STDMEM. This, fully realized, could be a boon.. imagine storing the data files for programs in the memory expander..then switching back and forth as needed..
- 2) SBII (abbrev.) also allows calls to the music chip and to the sprites..although exactly HOW is not known save to the designer.. More on this later as it develops...
- 3) SBII has a slightly jazzes-up screen display and also has definitions for some of the dedicated function keys..PRINT is the same as Ctrl-P, INSERT the same as Ctrl-M, and DELETE the same as Ctrl-O.
- 4) SBII allows you to break a Ctrl-P with a Ctrl-C..so you can recover from a screen dump without having to reset the computer.
- 5) SBII has a larger free space for programs, EVEN THOUGH SBII is larger than SBI. (FRE(O) shows about 7K more space than SBI.)
- 6) SBII allows you to merge files together...Format for this is MERGE <filename>.. It loads the designated file into memory and merges it with the current program..If any line numbers are the same, the new ones replace the old, just as if you had retyped the lines.
- 7) a minor point..SBII has a redesigned jump table and function call addresses are NOT the same.. so a program that runs in SBI that make use of the SmartBasic direct function CALLS will NOT WORK without major modification.

Thou Shalt Not Dupe

Either Way It's Wrong

People who would never walk into a store and shoplift a software product think nothing of making several copies of the same software. The results are the same. The act is just as wrong.

When it comes to unauthorized duplication of software, many people do not realize the costly impact on the software developer and the customer community. The relationship between customer and developer in a software transaction is one of mutual trust. The customer trusts that the developer has produced a product that will deliver the desired result, performs according to specifications, and is properly documented and supported. The developer trusts that the customer will make use of only those copies for which he has purchased a license, even though making additional, unauthorized copies

violates the U.S. Copyright Law, and unfairly deprives software developers of revenue they are entitled to receive for their work.

Software developers find that thousands of illegal copies have been made by customers who either innocently believe they are doing nothing wrong or simply choose to ignore the law.

The Law is Clear

Reproducing computer software without authorization violates the U.S. Copyright Law. It is a Federal offense. The money paid for a software product represents a license fee for the use of one copy. It does not represent an authorization to copy. Civil damages for unauthorized software copying can be as much as \$50,000 or more and criminal penalties include fines and imprisonment. Bills have been introduced in Congress to strengthen the law and increase penalties.

Myths and Facts of Software

Let's start by dispelling some myths with a few facts.

First, software developers *do not* condone unauthorized copying in order to gain market penetration.

Second, the price of software *does not* make unauthorized copying justifiable. The cost of a software product to a consumer represents only a small fraction of the publisher's development and marketing costs.

Third, although the cost of *softlifting* is borne initially by the software developer, it is paid for ultimately by legitimate users.

What It Means to You

It's obvious that legitimate software users are paying for theft along with software developers.

It's obvious, too, that no one is going to put up with it for long. Think twice before you ask someone to give you an illegal copy of their software. Think three times before you offer to do it for someone else. *Softlifting* or *software piracy* is not only a crime: it's simply wrong.

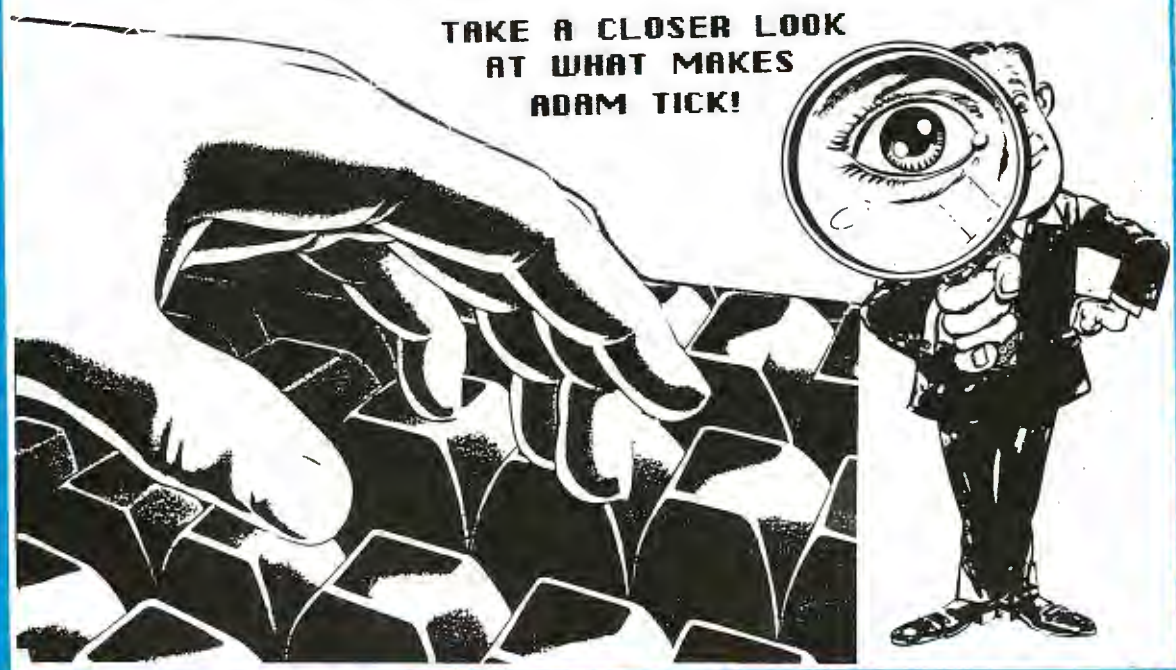

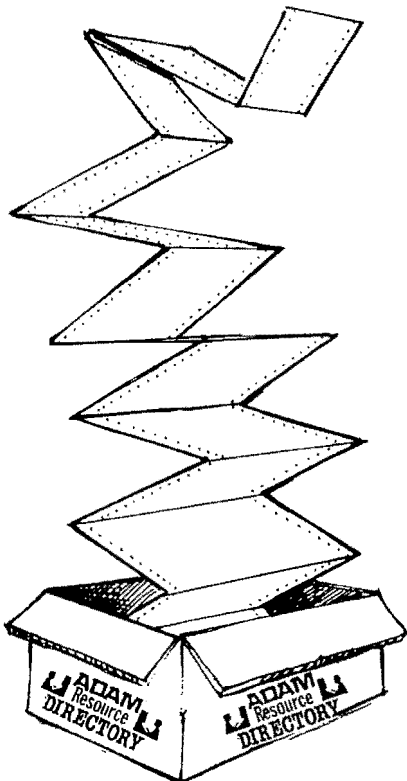

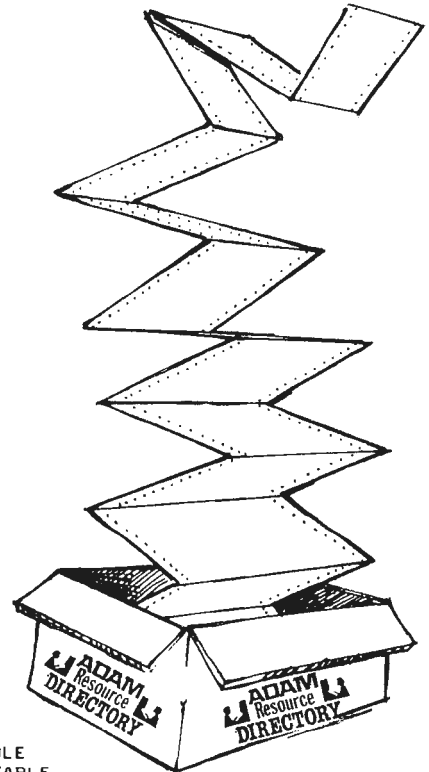

Adam System Calls

ADAM SYSTEM CALLS

Over the last year I have spent a substantial amount of time disassembling the ADAM operating system. Actually the ADAM has two operating systems that have been designated EOS and OS7. The OS7 system is essentially the Colecovision cartridge system and this is used to handle most of the sound and graphics that are produced on the ADAM. The EOS is the ADAM's primary operating system that handles I/O and other system functions.

This column will be used to present the various system calls that are available to the user in SmartBasic. This column will not be a tutorial on assembly or machine language programming. I will simply present the information with a brief explanation of its function and how it is used, what you do with it is up to you. To use the calls you will have to understand the Z80 and its machine language. In most cases you will have to write machine language routines in order to provide the called routines with the information that they require. In previous issues I have already given some information on writing such routines for using some of the calls to the video display processor and the sound chip.

As I said earlier, I have spent a lot of time disassembling the Adam's operating system. After I had completed that task, Coleco provided us with a copy of their technical manual for the ADAM. Unfortunately the technical manual is not very well organized and contains what I consider to be some major gaps. The manual clearly is not designed for the novice. Even though I have the manual, I feel that much of what I learned in disassembling the OS was more than worth while. Unfortunately, the technical manual includes almost nothing on SmartBasic and its memory map. For that information you should consult the previous issues of ECN for many peeks and pokes and the Hacker's Guide to ADAM which is a great deal more organized (the Hacker's Guide is available for \$12.95 from Peter & Ben Hinkle, 117 Northview Road, Ithaca, NY 14850 or MW Ruth Co.).

In this column numbers will generally be presented in hex format and will be so designated by a following '\$' sign, for example: 4D32\$. All numbers without the dollar sign will be in regular decimal format. Each of the CALL statements will include a description of the registers used for input in the call and a description of the output registers, if any. We will publish a few CALLS each issue until we have covered the entire list of CALLS available.

First of all you should know that the operating system CALLS do not directly address any routines, but are directed to a jump table that contains another CALL instruction and the actual location of the routine. For example the CALL FC30\$ (64560) actually CALLS a routine at F832\$ (63538). This was done so that the CALL statement would remain the same for a particular routine even if the routine were changed and placed in a new location. So revisions to the operating system could be made without affecting any existing programs provided they used only CALLS to the jump table. Programs which failed to follow this practice would not run. This is probably the reason some cartridge games will not run correctly on the stand-alone ADAM (Defender is one example).

CALL FC30\$ (64560) - This routine executes a system reset and causes the operating system to check the various devices for a disk or data pack.

The order of the check is device #4, #5, #8 and #24. Device #4 is disk drive #1; #5 is disk drive #2; #8 is data drive #1 and #24 is data drive #2. If one of the drives contain media, then block #0 is read to locate boot instructions if none is present or an error is encountered then the system loads the Electronic Typewriter from ROM. If a boot record is present the system loads it to C800\$ (51800) and branches to it where the boot routine takes control. In addition this routine performs a number of housekeeping functions such as clearing video RAM, turning off the sound and setting up the Device Control Blocks (DCB's).

CALL FC33\$ (64563) - Display the character whose value is stored in register A. This one is easy to check out. All you have to do is place a value in the A register (LDA x) and CALL the routine. The character will be displayed at the current cursor position and the cursor will be moved one place to the right. This routine will not execute the control characters, but will instead print them on the screen if there is a corresponding graphic character in video RAM.

CALL FC36\$ (64566) - Initialize the video display screen. HL register contains the video RAM screen address. This information appears to be stored in memory at FD64\$ (64868). Additional information needed by this call and the associated registers are as follows: B register = line length -1 (normally 31); C register = screen lines -1 (23); D register = cursor position (column); E register = cursor position (row).

CALL FC39\$ (64569) - Send a character to the screen and display it or execute the appropriate action if the code represents a control character. The code for the character is stored in the A register. Most of the control characters are described in the SmartBasic manual.

CALL FC3C\$ (64572) - This is a delay that is executed after a hard reset. It is approximately 40 micro-seconds in duration. Only the A register is killed (cleared).

CALL FC3F\$ (64575) - Checks the DCB command/status byte to determine status of printer. Reissues print command to a busy printer if no error is returned. The A register return the error code, if any. This routine is used with the start-up call.

CALL FC42\$ (64578) - Calls the same routine listed above (FC3F\$).

That completes the calls for this issue. Next issue we'll have more.

CALL FC45\$ (64581) - This routine checks on I/O progress. Checks on DCB (device control block). Determines if I/O read is complete and error free. A register contains the device ID at start and the error code, if any, is returned in the A register.

Adam System Calls Cont...

CALL FC48\$ (64584) - Similar to FC45\$ but used for the keyboard I/O. A register usage is the same.

CALL FC4B\$ (64587) - Get keyboard key or current status. If key press has occurred place key in buffer. Error code, if any, is returned in register A. This appears to be a non-waiting command.

CALL FC4E\$ (64590) - checks I/O status following a write. A register is device ID and error code, if any, is returned in A register.

CALL FC51\$ (64593) - checks I/O write status of printer. A register is device ID and error code is returned in A register.

CALL FC54\$ (64596) - Finds the Device Control Block for a specified device ID. A register is the device ID and IY contains the start of the DCB.

CALL FC57\$ (64599) - Identical to FC54\$.

CALL FC5A\$ (64602) - Get address of Processor Control Block (PCB) for current PCB. Starting address returned in IY register.

CALL FC5D\$ (64605) - This is a Hard Init. All devices are reset and all PCBs and DCBs are cleared and checks for all active devices.

CALL FC60\$ (64608) - sends OF\$ to port 3F\$, wait 2ms, send OD\$ to port 3F\$. This is essentially a hard reset of the ADAM NET.

CALL FC63\$ (64611) - send a string to the printer. The location of the string is stored in HL register and the string must be terminated by an ETX (this is simply the value 03). Any error code is returned in the A register.

CALL FC66\$ (64614) - send one character to the printer. The character is stored in A register and any error code is returned in the A register.

CALL FC69\$ (64617) - read a block from a block device. Register A is the device number, HL register contains the destination address of the data, register BCDE contains the block number to be read.

CALL FC6C\$ (64620) - read a character from the keyboard and store it in the A register. If there is an error the error code is returned in the A register.

CALL FC6F\$ (64623) - read DCB return codes (completion code) for keyboard. Code returned in A register.

CALL FC72\$ (64626) - same as FC6F\$ for printer.

CALL FC75\$ (64629) - same as FC6F\$ for device specified in A register.

CALL FC78\$ (64632) - same as FC6F\$ for tape device.

CALL FC7B\$ (64635) - relocate current PCB (Processor Control Block?). Register HL contains new address of PCB.

CALL FC7E\$ (64638) - Initiate a status request command. IY register contains the address of DCB and error code, if any, is returned in register A.

CALL FC81\$ (64641) - similar to preceding but requests status of keyboard.

CALL FC84\$ (64644) - status of printer.

CALL FC87\$ (64647) - status of data drive.

CALL FC8A\$ (64650) - scan active devices. 1 DCB allocated for each device identified by a status request.

CALL FC8D\$ (64653) - initialize the I/O processor with control area at value in register HL.

CALL FC90\$ (64656) - reset the device whose number is in register A.

CALL FC93\$ (64659) - reset the keyboard.

CALL FC96\$ (64662) - reset the printer.

CALL FC99\$ (64665) - reset data drive.

CALL FC9C\$ (64668) - start-up typing a string to the printer, but does not wait for completion. Register HL contains the string.

CALL FC9F\$ (64671) - start-up typing a character to the printer, but does not wait for completion. Character is in register A.

CALL FCA2\$ (64674) - start-up a block read for device in register A. BCDE is the physical block to read and register HL contains memory location to store data.

CALL FCA5\$ (64677) - start-up a byte read for device in A. BC contains the byte requested and DE the destination for storing the byte.

CALL FCA8\$ (64680) Start-up a keyboard byte read.

CALL FCAB\$ (64683) Start up a write for a block device. Register A = device ID (low nibble is device address, high nibble is secondary device ID). HL register contains the source address in RAM of the data to transfer. BC and DE registers contain the sector number on the device. The error code if any is returned in the A register.

CALL FCAE\$ (64686) Start up a write for a byte (character) device. Register A = device ID, BC = number of bytes to write, HL = source of data, return error code in A.

CALL FCB1\$ (64689) Init bump. Start of a larger I/O routine. Carries out synchronization.

CALL FCB4\$ (64692) writes one block to a block driver. Register A = device id, HL = source address in RAM, BCDE = sector number on device, return error code in A.

CALL FCB7\$ (64695) Write byte (character) device. Register A = device ID, BC = number of bytes, HL = source of data, return error in A.

CALL FCB8\$ (64698) File Manager Init. Register DE = address of FCB buffers, HL address to place FCB headers.

CALL FCBD\$ (64701) Initialize tape directory. Register A = device ID, C = number of sectors in directory, DE = number of sectors in Device, HL = pointer to ASCII ETX terminated string (volume ID of 12 characters), return error in A.

CALL FCC0\$ (64704) Open file. Register A = device ID, HL = address of file name string, B = mode (sub-type), error returned in A.

CALL FCC3\$ (64707) Close a file. Register A = file number (1 or 2), return error in A.

Once you have created the Sprite data and Attribute table, you are ready to begin using your sprites. Since SmartBasic doesn't have commands that activate the sprites, it is done with a 40 byte machine language program. Below is an Assembly Language listing of this program, a memory mapped listing of the same program, and heavily REMarked data statements which will be loaded and used by your Basic programs.

Once your Sprite data and Attribute table is loaded starting at 27575 and 27447 respectively, and you are in one of ADAM's graphics modes, a 'CALL 27407' in your program will display your sprites. Every time you change any sprite's attributes, you will have to 'CALL 27407' to see the change. This is not to say that you must call 27407 for each individual change, but only that no change will be apparent until you call 27407.

***** SOME SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS *****

PRIORITIES

Think of sprites as being between you and the background of ADAM's screen. There are 32 levels or planes that the sprites move on, one on each plane. Sprite # 0 moves on the plane nearest to you and sprite # 31 moves on the plane closest to the background of the screen. If sprite # 0 is moved to the same screen location as sprite # 1, then sprite # 0 will cover all or part of sprite # 1. If any two sprites are moved to the same screen location, then the lower numbered sprite will cover all or part of the higher numbered sprite.

THE FIFTH SPRITE PROBLEM

ADAM can only display 4 sprites on any horizontal row. If five sprites are moved onto the same horizontal row, then the sprite with the highest number (or lowest priority) will become covered and will not be displayed even though it is actually still there. It is up to the programmer to insure that 5 sprites are never on the same horizontal row. If you experiment with this, you will see what I mean.

TURNING OFF UNWANTED SPRITES

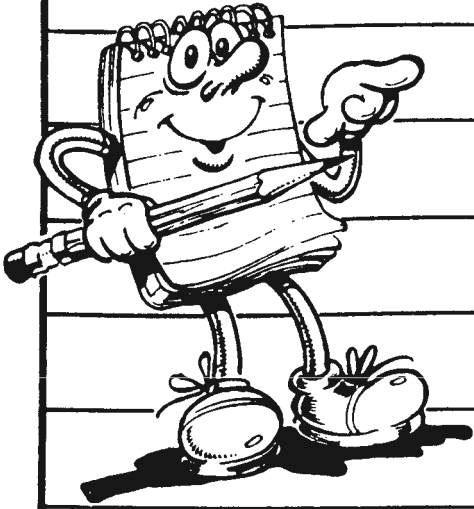
Let's say that you have the data for all 32 sprites loaded, but only want to use sprites # 0,1,2, & 3. Simply place a value of 208 decimal in the 'Y' coordinate position in the attribute set of sprite # 4 and all of the sprites from 4 through 31 will not be displayed.

CREATING AND SAVING SPRITES EASILY

During my quest to learn more about sprites, I modified a sprite editor that I downloaded from the Family Computing Data Library 6. The original program only allowed editing of sprites number 1 through 7. My modified version allows editing of all 32 sprites, uses less protected memory, is compatible with this sprite documentation, and will be more user friendly by the time I upload it to the DL. Look for it as 'GUILSprite'.

A better performing "blank" tape has been developed for the Coleco ADAM computer. A format overlay is applied that results in faster STORE and GET times (up to 60X), smoother tape handling, and more file capacity (up to 170X for Type 3S). These tapes are tailored for the word processing (WP) of short documents. As you well know, the ADAM has its limitations in working with long files. Compared to other WP's, it is sluggish editing files much longer than a few pages. While editing a 35-page document, ADAM required 85 seconds to insert one word and over 90 HOME key taps to scan it! Besides, short files can easily be merged later to form much larger documents. All other tapes use the memory space quite inefficiently, and they invariably operate slower, when mostly short files are entered. For those who still prefer using long files, or want to store mainly long computer programs, three of these types can be initialized to perform the same as the ADAM tapes (Types 1). One version, Type 1C, is identical to the ADAM tape and yet retains most of the smoother operation.

The most noticeable improvement is this smoother tape handling. Gone completely are the bone-chilling stops at the very end of the tape, and throughout the tape travel the stops and starts are a little more gentle. The smoother performance is retained even if the tape is initialized to produce the Coleco ADAM tape equivalent. After the first few files, those remaining will display about a sixty percent faster response in both the STORE and GET functions. When the tapes are initialized this higher-speed performance is lost.

As for file capacity, Type 1 tapes have slightly less, while Type 243 tapes have considerably more than the ADAM tapes. The various types are compared below.

The page length is taken to be 2700 characters which is typical of full pages that are single-spaced. There

will always be a few file locations that can accommodate files somewhat longer than those indicated above. Types 1C, 1S, and 1M are ready now; Types 2S, 2M, and 3S soon will be. Type 1L will be available later as per consumer demand.

Which type would be appropriate to start using? Some suggestions may be helpful. If you feel you have little or no need to initialize or copy these tapes, then Type 2S may be your best choice, otherwise Type 1S or 1M should be chosen depending on your anticipated file length. If you prepare only an occasional long document, remember it can be STORED to a Type 1C or ADAM tape, leaving the Types S & M tapes for your more frequent short documents. Type S is somewhat faster than Type M, and Type M, somewhat faster than Type L. If you are still uncertain, try one each of Types 1S, 1M, and 2S.

The tapes are copied from carefully prepared masters using high quality audio cassette decks operating at standard speed. Some modifications include replacing the record heads and introducing certain electronic changes to promote reliable copying and the smoother tape handling characteristics. Each copied tape is individually tested in the STORE and GET modes to assure reliable performance. A thirty-day warranty applies to any malfunction, but is limited to the cost of the tape.

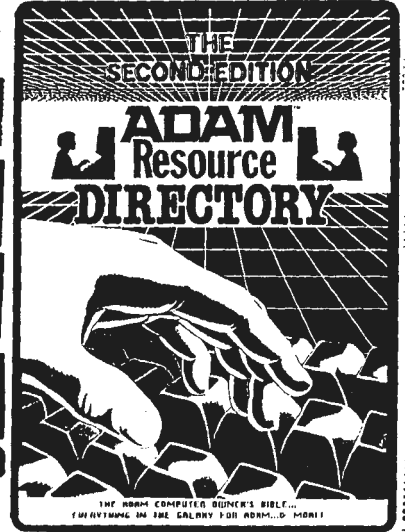

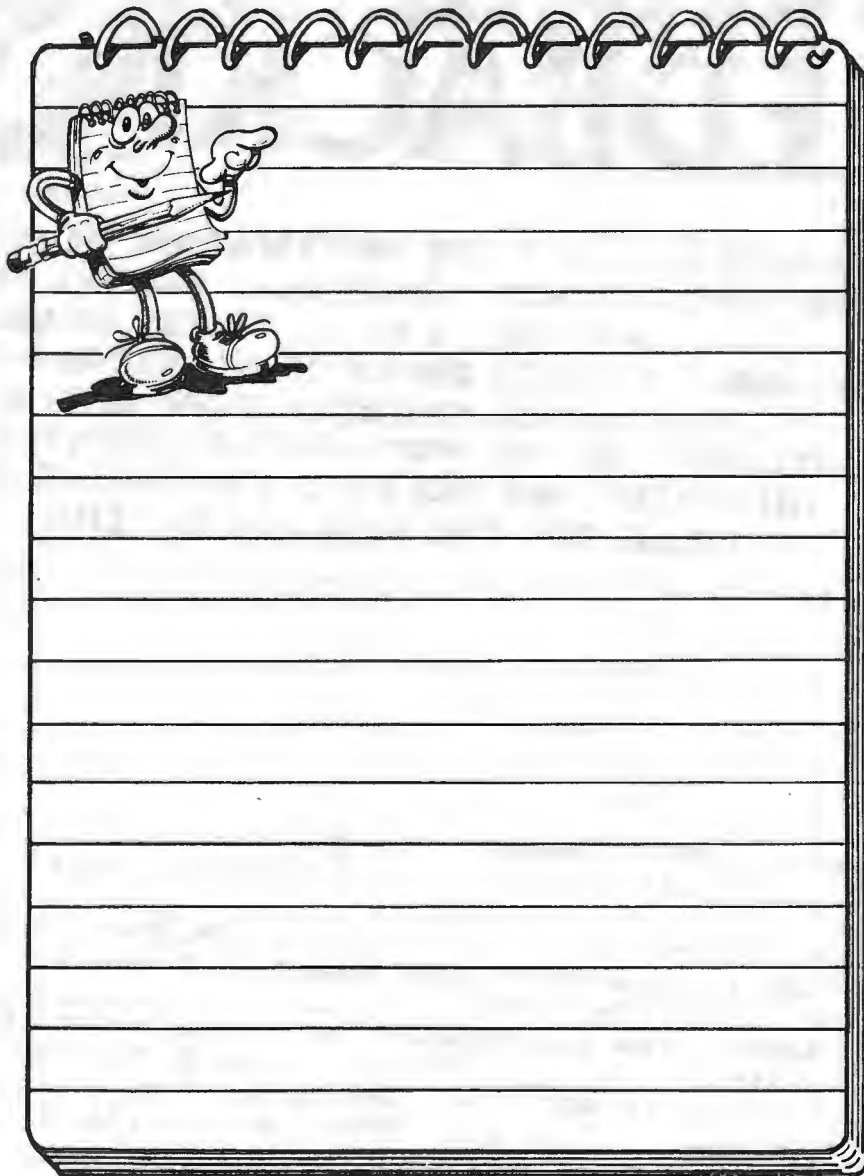

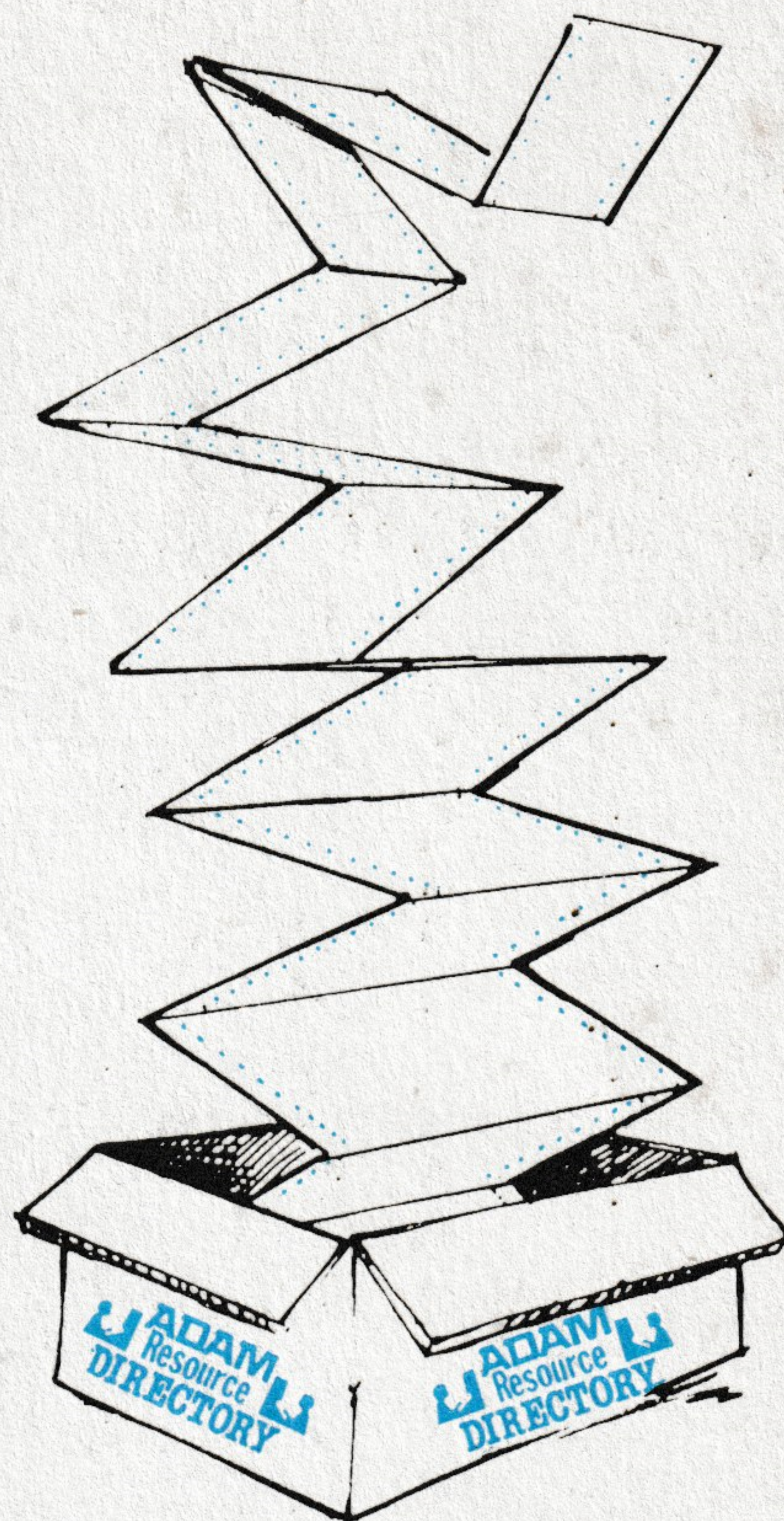
