## NEW &/OR FEATURED PD SOFTWARE

Documentation for BONUS! MOAUG february, 1988

The files are designed for experimenting with the altered  
boot block routine by Digital Express, allowing you to have  
a picture on your screen while BASIC loads. You will need  
to add BASIC to your medium. You can use the files on  
this medium to view high resolution graphics, RLE pictures,  
and SmartPaint formatted pictures.

The files on this BONUS! medium are:

BootPic... File that boots the opening screen. The crowning  
face next to it in directory seems that it is a 'system'  
file like the BASIC program; you cannot run it. It  
operates automatically when you reset computer with medium  
in drive.

BASICPGM... this is the BASIC language program.

BPdeluxe... Takes a hi-res picture from screen & stores on  
medium, giving you a BootPic file on your medium which will  
load your picture when pulling reset. To see its effects,  
you need to put the BASIC program on your medium afterward;  
use EZfileXfer or BASICxfer to do this. To use BPdeluxe,  
you must have a picture on your screen to start with.

EZfileXfer transfers any file from one medium to another.

Pix.NGR... allows you to load & save high resolution  
pictures in several formats, including RLE (the type usually  
transferred by modes), HRP, and SmartPaint format pictures.  
To run Pix.NGR, enter the command NGR (return), then BRUK  
Pix.NGR (return). Pix.NGR also allows options for changing  
the background screen, etc.

ezfileXfer is a binary converted version of EZfileXfer  
above. It works exactly the same but loads faster.

BASICxfer is a program for the specific purpose of  
transferring SmartBASIC 1.0 from a medium in one drive to a  
second medium in a different drive, even if there are  
already files on the second medium.

This continues a previous project to make Adam Owners aware of the various sources for PD software available to them.

NIAD, POBX 1317 Lisle IL 60532 (membership \$19/yr) make available to members some of the best written public domain software available including the following areas: (1) Coleco PD items; (2) SmartBasic (25 different volumes); (3) Smart Logo (3 vols.); (4) AdamCalc (2 vols.); (5) Basic Utilities (2 Vols.); (6) CPM (42 vols.); (7) pinball games ; and more. Again these are just for members. Send SASE to request list of PD software & their membership application.

AWAUG, Washington Area AUG has many very good PD software programs available at very reasonable prices. Due to problems in working out a reprint agreement with them, I will NOT be able to publish a list of their programs in this issue of the newsletter. Send SASE to AWAUG 7814 Worthing Court Alexandria VA 22310. I have purchased some of their software and it is good.

ST.L.AUG has some very good PD software, a list of which appears in each issue of its newsletter and is available to both members & non-members alike.

DIGITAL EXPRESS POBX 37 Oak Hill WV 25901 has some of the best and most professionally written public domain software available. It is of commercial quality. This is probably because much of it is professionally written. Rather than charge for every little thing they produce, they have donated many many programs into public domain. Send them a SASE (2 stamps) to receive their 15 page list of PD software which consisted of six libraries consisting of 57 individual volumes and more than 6.5 MB of programs as of March 1, 1988. More is being constantly added. Digital Express publishes NIBBLES & BITS NEWSLETTER and subscribers to the newsletter, receive the PD software (& other items including commercial software) from Digital Express at reduced member rates. Nearly all of them come with some instruction. Their SmartBasic 1.0 Library contains games, graphics, math and utilities. A separate Graphics library contains pictures, art, fonts, clips, sprites, letter heads, etc. for use with various commercial graphics software. Their Coleco PD Library contains many of the much sought after Coleco programs which are now PD. Their CP/M 2.2 Library contains games, utilities, etc. There also is a Pinball Games Library and a Miscellaneous Collections which includes Multiwrite improvements by our own Jim Guenzel, as well as the excellent double disk formater. You really should send in for their complete catalog.

Metro Orlando AUG 1003 Oak Ln. Apopka Fl. 32703 has an excellent PD library at reasonable prices. It contains many of the same programs found in gHAAUG & Nibbles & Bits PD libraries, as well as some more unique items.

PUGET SOUND ADAM NEWSNET or PSAN 22607 SE 322nd, Kent WA 98042 has some of the very best PD software I have seen from an AUG. Its Toolkit series of utilities is one of my personal favorites and all are very well write & very professional in nature with many innovations in menus & directories. Very reasonably priced. Send SASE to them for their list of PD software which is available to members & non-members alike.

The purpose behind this program is to be able to load and save smartbasic programs super fast. This program is very nice for disk drive owners and a must for DD drive users. Some of the features of FASTRUN are:

Save any smartbasic program up to 4 times faster.  
Load or run converted programs up to 11 times faster.

Once loaded into memory FASTRUN will remain there waiting for the "fr" command for easy program conversion.

Reduces the storage size of larger programs.

Current screen colors are automatically saved.

Includes program to easily copy FASTRUN.

For those of you who have "TURBOLOAD" Practical Programs will give you a package deal including BASIC MANAGER (reviewed in last months issue by Jim Guenzel) and FASTRUN for 10.95 US\$ upon receiving your original TurboLoad datapack or disk. Considering you get MULTI-LOADER free with any software purchase it seems to be a pretty good deal.

Other than a couple of minor bugs in my copy I would highly recommend FASTRUN to any DD drive owners and recommend it to any impatient disk drive owners. I would say this product is more userfriendly than TurboLoad and has more functions, the only drawback or improvement I can see would be the instructions to either simplify or give more examples for the average user.

It is really nice to be able to put a datapack with MULTI-LOADER and FASTRUN in the data drive and not have to wait all day to run a smartbasic program. I hope the people at Practial Programs keep coming out with new software for ADAM like this.

First of all MEMSWAP requires exclusive use of the 64k memory expansion board. This is not a part of your original adam system and must be purchased separately. This program works with most smartbasic v1.0 and not smartbasic v2.0 operating systems.

MEMSWAP is just what it sounds like a memory swap which allows you to keep three programs for easy use. One program is in normal memory and two are stored in the 64k expansion memory. SW1 and SW2 smartbasic commands swap the current program, drive and screen colors stored in the first or second program storage channels in the 64k expansion memory. Also included is the "copyMS" file to copy MEMSWAP to datapack or disk and select either automatic run "y" or "n" to not have your program run after memswapping. MS=run program ms=do not run program. Memswap may be run anytime after smartbasic is loaded.

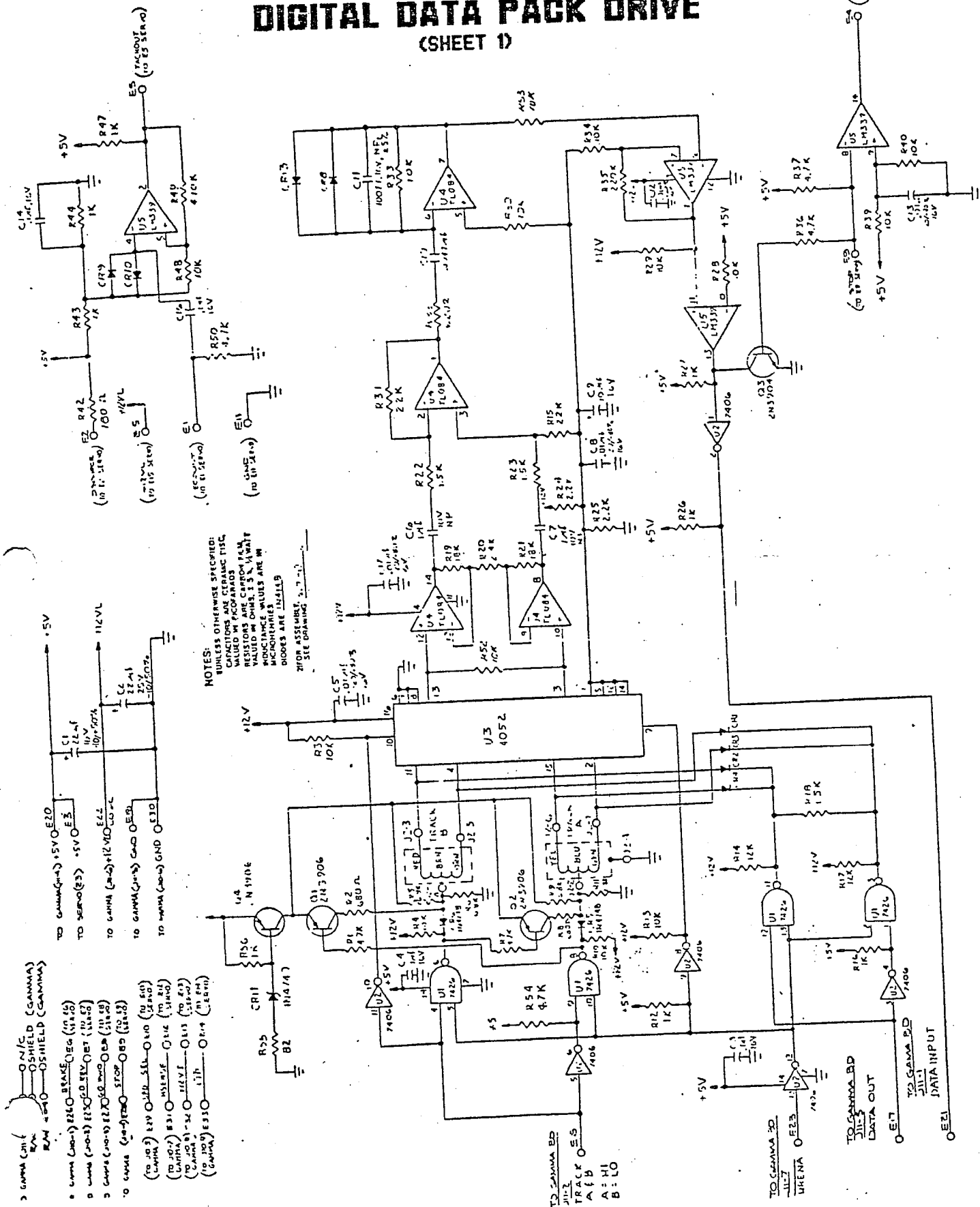
MEMSWAP is a nice program to have allowing you to access two programs other than the one in current memory without having to catalog or load filenames from data or disk drive again. One of my favorite uses of MEMSWAP is to have it directly load Pro-Load (see Jim Guenzel's review in last months issue on MULTI-LOADER which also comes with this program) with the "run file" command. By doing this you have easy access to file names and can load your three programs using Pro-load.

For what it does using the 64k memory board this is a useful product I just have to wonder if they have anything in mind in the near future for the 128,256, and the 512k expansion memory boards!

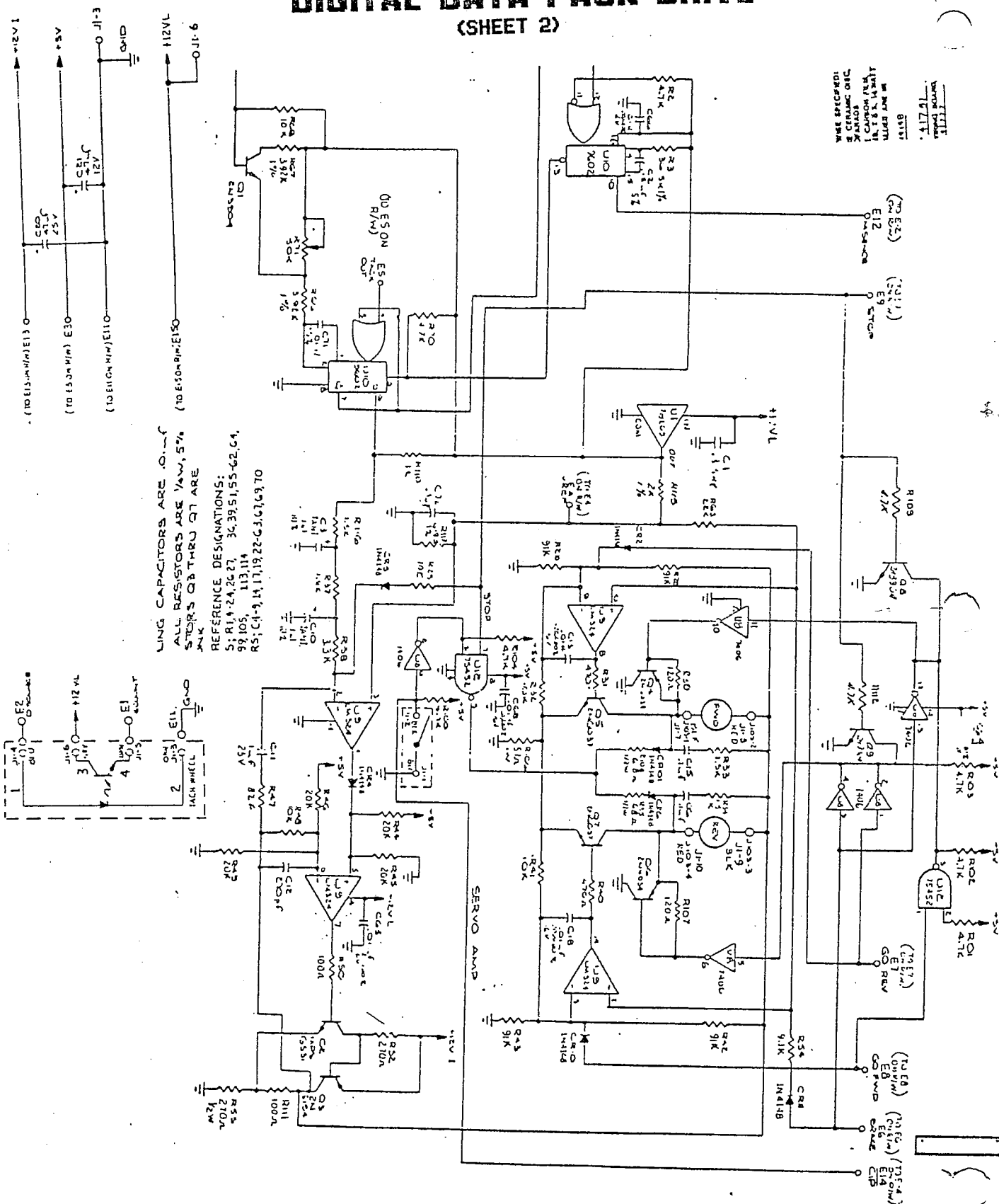

**GO.COM FOR CP/M.**

PH (?Peter Hartzler) writes in the March AWAUG that in standard ADAM CP/M 2.2 you execute a program by typing its name at the CP/M prompt; if you want to run a program twice in a row, you simply type the name over again and the computer RE-READS the program into memory. A FASTER WAY is to use GO.COM a program which restarts the last program run without having to re-read it into RAM.

At the CP/M prompt type this line: SAVE 0 GO.COM. (Thats save ZERO not the letter O). GO.COM is now in the directory taking up exactly NO space and only 1 directory entry. Type GO and the last program run will run again, without any delay for re-reading into memory, unless you have overwritten it somehow.

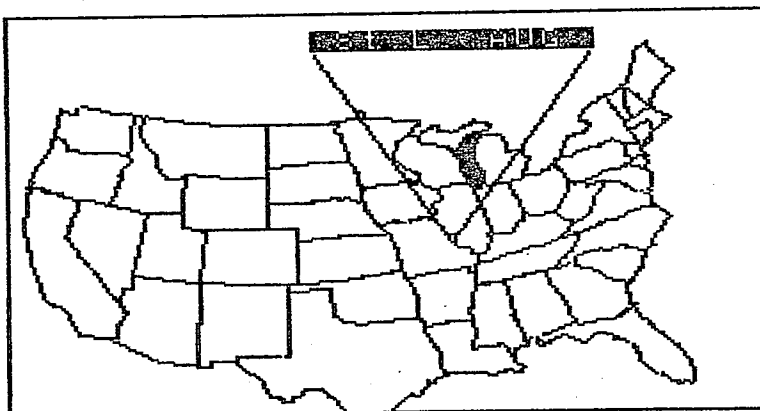

This makes it possible for other Coleco software, such as ADAMcalc, SmartWriter and SmartLOGO, to access your memory expander for file storage. The package requires MegaDisk 1.0 (also available from Digital Express) and is recommended for those with memory expanders of 128K or larger. The price is only \$11.95, or \$9.95 for Nibbles & Bits

subscribers.

2. PaintAide. Just what the title implies, PaintAide is a software package to be used with PowerPaint. This allows you to customize your PowerPaint program so that you can have pre-installed fonts and background colors. More importantly, the package comes with twenty sets of FontPOWER font sets. Font sets are used by PowerPaint to make custom page layouts and fancy titles for pictures, greeting cards, announcements, newsletters and so forth. Whats more, the font sets can be used in your own SmartBasic programs to give a really professional look. As an added bonus, a program is also included which will convert any FontPOWER font set to a SHAPE TABLE that can be used in the graphic modes (HGR & HGR2) of SmartBasic. **BBS HINT FROM PSAN AUG**

It is also a good idea to save a record of your call by opening a file and storing the information. That way you can review it after you are done calling so your next call will go more smoothly. To open a file, press the WILDCARD key to go into command mode. Press SmartKey VI (FILE). Now press SmartKey II (RECEIVE). You will be prompted for the drive and filename. When finished, press SmartKey V (DONE). You are now back into the command mode. Press the WILDCARD key, and you will be in terminal mode. Now everything that you see on your screen will be saved in a file! When done, press the UNDO key to close the file.

**WE ARE THE OBVIOUS SOLUTION**

ORPHANWARE now has a patch available for Coleco's ADAMcalc spreadsheet program that allows you to use a standard parallel interfaced dot matrix printer. The program is being marketed by Orphanware for \$9.95 (plus S/H). CALCPAT was written by Thomas E. Clary. The BASIC program reads a block from your ADAMcalc backup, changes the print output, and then writes the new data back to your disk or DDP.

Anthony Yulo says, an even better program than the EDIT program from Hackers Guide is CP/M's DDT. You can transfer SmartBASIC programs to CP/M with ADAM.COM and back to SmartBASIC with CPMADAM.COM. To change programs or merge them together just POKE a 201 into 6356. This will disable the NEW command in SmartBASIC and allow you to load two, three, etc. programs into one large one. The only drawback is that if the programs have the same line number, the latest one will be kept and the old ones erased. Be sure to POKE a 205 back when you are done. Are you limited to only 128 characters per line in SmartBASIC? If you POKE a 239 into 12185, this will increase your line length to 239 characters. This will allow you to put more commands on one line and save your memory because each BASIC line uses 5 bytes per line.

FAMILY COMPUTING Magazine will change its name to FAMILY IN-HOME-OFFICE COMPUTING this month. Information from readers show 65% of them work out of their homes.

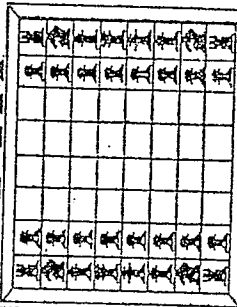

This month my article is a user's review of one of the many locally operated ADAM support ELECTRONIC BULLETIN BOARD SYSTEMS. This system is ran by the local ADAM users group ADAM-LINK OF UTAH.

If you're using the ADAMlink software, your modem PARAMETERS should be at the DEFAULT SETTINGS. If using other modem software, set your modem as follows:

EVEN PARITY, AUTO-LINE FEED OFF

The system has a number of message bases where different topics are covered. Even though I have listed most of the OPEN ACCESS areas of this BBS, you will only be given access to one or two of the message bases until you are given higher access.

Sub-Boards:

1. General Area
2. SPORTS
3. Hooter's Place
4. GAMES AND JOKES
5. Hackers Delight
6. ADAM-LINK of Utah

I find it very enjoyable to call this local BBS. The users are willing to help. To top this off, this bulletin board system is FULLY ran on the ADAM in SmartBASIC / EOS!!

But, I find that the program the BBS is running from needs two minor changes / updates. (1) The adding of commands that will let users read only NEW messages left since the last time the user called. (I understand that Alan Neeley, this system's head sysop, is already working on adding this feature.) (2) Adding XMODEM protocol to the file transfer sub-programs.

If you live in the west, be sure to give this ADAM support BBS a call!

Now on to another topic. As I type this (Mid-November), I am watching the FCC / TELECOMMUNICATION HEARINGS on C-SPAN (the CONGRESS SATELLITE SYSTEM) on my local cable system and it does not look good for us users of PACKET SWITCHING DATA COMMUNICATION BASES, eg, CIS, PLink, TELENET, ect. systems. 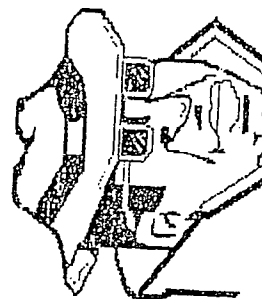

AUTOWRITER is a rather unique BASIC programming aide; it allows you to create programs containing routines that you select. The resulting program can then be merged with existing software or used as a starter for new programs to make use of the nice features of the routines. Unlike other BASIC enhancements, you decide which machine language routines (and BASIC subroutines) that you want for the module.

You simply insert the medium in the drive and pull computer reset. In a few seconds, Mr. T's logo screen will appear while the remainder of the program loads into RAM. Then you'll have the option to set the program's NMI clock. The AUTOWRITER program is done on a 40 column screen enhanced with inverse fonts and SmartKEY labels at the bottom of the screen. Six primary options are presented: (I) machine code routines, (II) BASIC routines, (III) POKES and CALLS, (IV) save lines in memory, (V) print options, and (VI) quit. The first two options let you select the routines that you want for your module. The third option will list the routines or allow you to search through them by entering a keyword. The fourth option stores the module to tape or disk. The fifth option will print the routines on paper.

Many of the routines are derived from ones we've printed in N&B, for example, instant underscored fonts, instant text color changes, and text on hi-res screens. You could hunt through back issues for some of these, adjust the addresses so that they are compatible, and type them in. This alone could become a major project. AUTOWRITER frees you from this keypress drudgery allowing you to spend your programming time on the body of your programs rather than on the enhancements which make them appealing and user - friendly.

Yes, AUTOWRITER automatically adjusts the addresses of the included machine language routines so that you may combine them in any sequence!! This alone is quite a creative feat. Moreover, the programming time that this innovative utility will save you and the professional features of the program make it a very good value.

One of the most frequent questions that beginning programmers ask is "How do I use sprites in games?". That question was difficult to answer since SmartBASIC was not designed with sprites or sprite animation in mind. Now, however, we have Sprite Power. This program not only answers the question; but, is also a versatile tool in manipulating sprites, designing sprites, saving sprite data, and answering questions that most of us haven't even thought to ask!

The program is totally machine code; operation is FAST. And, like other Digital Express software, Sprite Power is menu-driven and user selections are made via SmartKEYs. A nice feature about the program is that there are 3 pre - defined sprite files included: alphabet letters, geometric figures, and miscellaneous objects. My favorite are the objects. You can load the sprites and then choose the "Animate Sprites" function. By switching back and forth between several sprites, it's easy to see a jumping cowboy or a talking starboy. Designing sprites is easy. The required program controls are shown on-screen so that you can sit down and start designing sprites immediately. The sprite design is created by filling in squares on a 16 x 16 grid, which is 8 times larger than a normal sized sprite. You have the ability to reverse the design grid, invert it, and flip the design.

When done designing your sprites, you save your creations by using the "store file" option. Your sprites can be saved to tape or disk in 3 different forms: ASCII DATA, BASIC BINARY, or Z80 BINARY. Another feature of the program is the ability to capture portions of hi-res graphic pictures as sprites. PUFF is included as a hands-on example of how sprites can be used in an arcade quality game! This game alone makes the program worth the \$14.95. Sprite Power, with its 25-page manual, is the programmer's answer to sprite design and control -- another winner from DIGITAL EXPRESS.

# SMARTWRITER TIPS



D. Zimmerman-->We all know by now that ADAM will add an extra 1/2 line feed on the printer when it encounters a line with nothing but a carriage return. This will cause the printer to print closer to the bottom of the page or spill over to the next page. If there is any thing besides the carriage return on the line the printer will advance only one line as it should. I solved this a long time ago by cutting of the tilde from the plastic printwheel with a scissors. I press this key before I enter a carriage return on a line with no text. The small sideways "s" appears on the screen but will not print because it was cut off. If the tilde is ever needed, I simply change the printwheel. I did not think it was possible, but I see where Irwin Singer came up with a better way. He uses the CONTROL 6 key followed by a single space. When the CONTROL 6 key is pressed an upside "L" appears on the screen. This character will not print on the paper and it WILL bomb the printer if it is NOT followed by a SPACE so be sure to add one space.

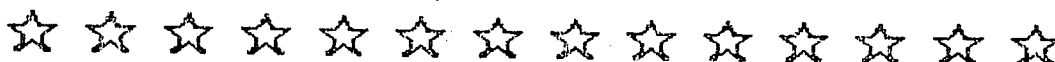
Use the old trick of using two rubber bands to stop the paper from sliding in the printer. Remove the printer cover and place one three inch (unstretched) rubber band on both the left and right side of the cover. Replace the cover. It only takes seconds to lift each rubber band and stretch it over the tabs that stick up on the paper hold down bar. Lift them off when the bar must be raised for paper adjustment.

Forcing SMARTWRITER to REFORMAT text to changed margins.--When you change the setting of the margins ADAM will normally change the text appearing on the screen to conform to the new settings. The user can tell is ADAM is reformatting the text by watching the left hand white vertical marker that appears on the left hand ruler line. When ADAM reformats on-screen text the marker will scroll from the top to the end of the text when the DONE key is pressed. If the marker fails to scroll the text will not be re-formatted. ADAM can be forced to re-format at any time. Hit SK I, then SK II, then SK V, then SK VI. The left hand marker will scroll and all text will be re-formatted. This is even faster than entering the commands in the old Word Star program. Besides, ADAM will re-format the entire document regardless of the cursor placement.  
(I do not know where this originally appeared. If anyone knows, let your editor know so I can give credit.)

Mike Keith-->I have read in several places that the best way to avoid the extra 1/2 line feed is to cut a character off of the daisy wheel. It seems that people are saying that other methods will not work in all situations. I have found an easier way. If you hold down the CONTROL key and press 6 at the same time, then hit the space bar and then the carriage return you will then have the correct spacing. There are two "catches" to this. First, this must be done with the cursor under the first character of the preceeding line. If that line starts with one or more spaces, indent the above procedure the same number of spaces. The second "catch" is that there MUST BE A SPACE BETWEEN THE SYMBOL ON THE SCREEN AND THE CARRIAGE RETURN SYMBOL. I have found that this works everytime.

Does anyone have a "fix" to the extra spaces problem in Show Off II? I have found that if you tell ADAM that you are using fan-fold paper in printing your document, Show Off II will add several spaces between words on the line where the page would advance if you were using the ADAM printer. This is not always the same place with Show Off II. I could use any ideas.--Mike Keith

For quite some time now, I have wanted to add an ATARI ten key to my ADAM. Seemed like it may be a simple operation - since the ten key hooks up to the joystick port on Atari, and Atari joysticks are compatible with ADAM's. I ordered the Atari ten key knowing full well that it probably would not work, and I would be out some bucks. Well, when it arrived, I hooked it up and nothing happened. ADAM could care less whether it was on or not.

I kept the darn thing hoping that one day, I would be able to convert it to my ADAM. Then one day, I received a catalog from ADAM's House. They were offering documentation sheets to add a mouse to ADAM. It sounded interesting - since I had similar wishes for hooking a Commodore mouse to ADAM. When the sheets arrived, I was surprised to find that it also included a schematic to hook up the Atari 10 key to ADAM! It was almost like a dream come true. Now, I not going to tell how to convert the ten key for ADAM. But I will show you the concept behind the conversion, show you what you will need, and how well it works.

The concept behind the conversion is rather simple. The Atari ten key is radically different from ADAM's joystick. In order to convert it, the circuit board on the 10 key must be disabled, and replaced with a circuit board from an ADAM joystick.

Well just what do you need for the ten key conversion. First you will need the "Mouse for ADAM" Documentation sheet from ADAM's House (price \$2.00). You will also need a additional joystick (available from MW Ruth 2 for \$5.95). And lastly you will need a ATARI CX85 ten key. The ten key is available from BG Micro for \$14.95. However, they are closing them out, and they may not have any more in stock. Atari has them available for \$24.95. Addresses for BG Micro and Atari are listed on the end of this article.

How well does it work? Well, the answer is that it works good with some programs and not so well with others. It seems a little slow when used with SmartWriter. However, It works Excellent with ADAMCalc and SmartBasic (with a modified version of MoreKEYS by Nibbles and Bits). I feel that since it works so well with ADAMCalc, that alone makes it worth the cost. I do alot of work with ADAMCalc, and it really speeds up the process of entering data. I also do alot of programming and the ten key helps alot there too. Especially when working with data statements.

To modify MoreKEYS: (see N&B 8/87 p. 13)

1. Change the 44 in line 650 to a 13
2. Change the 13 in line 670 to a 44.

You should however note that the Documentation sheets themselves are not very well written. They are hand drawn and hand written. It would be nice if someone would redo them again. The total cost of the conversion will cost you at least \$16.95 and at the most \$32.90. I certainly hope this article is some use to you. 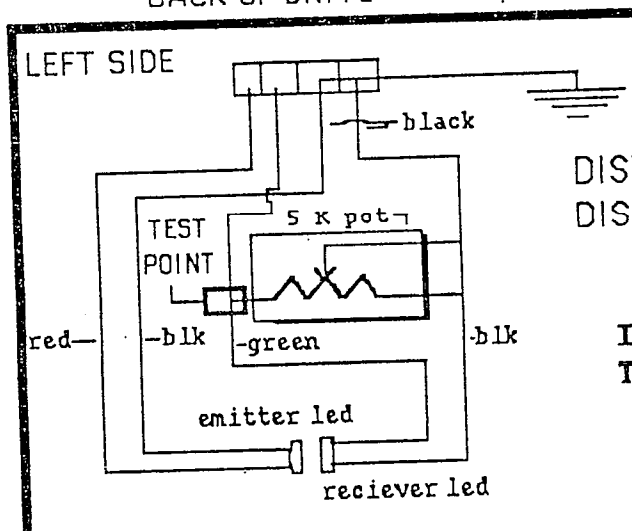
### COLECO DISK DRIVE PROBLEM AND FIX...

**SYMPTOM:** Drive does not spin when new disk is placed in drive - i.e. drive does not recognize disk removal, replacement.

**PROBLEM:** D.C. volts on receiver diode is too high (12 v. dc.) and change in volts from "disk out" ( $< .8$  v. dc.) to "disk in" ( $> .5$  volt change) does not trigger circuit.

**SOLUTION:** A 5K pot is placed across the green (+volts dc) and the black (ground) wires to the lower diode and adjusted so that "disk out" volts is less than .8dc ( $< .8$  v. dc.) and the change with "disk in" is greater than .5 volts ( $> .5$  v. dc change). **NOTE:** A 3 or 5 K resistor would work just as well I think, but I like the idea of an adjustable pot.

#### BACK OF DRIVE



DISK OUT --  $< .8$  V. DC AT TEST POINT  
DISK IN --  $> .5$  V. DC CHANGE WILL TRIGGER  
THE CIRCUIT.

I set the voltage at about 0.5 at the  
TEST POINT and it works just fine.

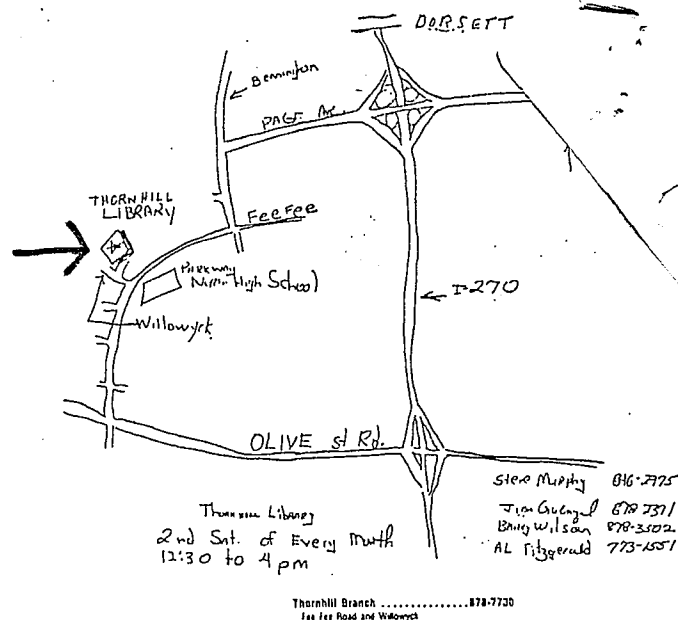

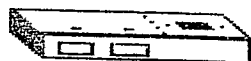
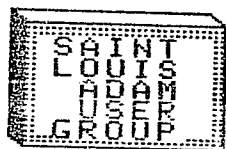
