DearAUG,

Are you interested in changing screen parameters? Would you like to vary FLASH, CURSOR shape, SCROLLING? READ ON...

FLASH is controlled by a zero page routine. 9F(159) contains the value that is decremented to 0 before the next flash cycle. Poke values in there between 1 and 255 to make the FLASH rate progressively slower.

The number of significant digits displayed for a numerical output is controlled by 3F32(16178). This location is useful when printing dollar figures.

Cursor definition is controlled by the ASC value in 4239(16953). Poke the ASCII value of the shape you want for your cursor. Some of the interesting values are 0, 1, 95, 127, 128, 129, 255.

Blank spaces on the screen are filled in by the value of 423A(16954). Poke the ASCII value of the character you wish to have. Some of the interesting values are 1, 39, 44, 45, 95, 124, 127, 128, 129, 255.

Screen Scrolling is controlled by values in a table starting at 4261(16993). 16993 controls at what line the scrolling will start (default 24). 16995 will set aside the top part of the screen which will not scroll (default 0). There are other values in this table which I do not yet fully understand. Experiment with them.

The duration of CHR\$(7) is controlled by the value in 4628(17963). Poke values in there between (0 and 255 to make the bell last longer. If you examine the address before 4628, you may recognize familiar numbers for sound generation. Use them to change the tone of the bell if you wish.

First, a question. How do you run a HELLO program from disk? I've copied SmartBASIC to disk, but it still won't run.

Since you have been so helpful to me, I'll return the favor and give you my own views on some items. I hope other AUGies find these views helpful.

SmartLetters and Forms, a very simple program to use, has become a welcome friend of mine. I must tell you that I am the worst letter-writer I know. This program really helps us inept writers.

To use, you insert the DDP, press reset, and you're off. The many directories range from social to educational to business.

I recommend this program to every ADAM owner. I bought mine from Computer Entertainer, but it is available at most Toys R Us stores for \$19.95. It works and it's easy.

AUTO-AID by FutureVision: Get it! It makes things very easy to work with. I'm using the Auto-Aid commands, which are: move-copy = catalog; store-get = load-save; clear = text; and others. You can define almost any key to almost any function. I have: Wild Card = run; home = list; Smartkey I = keyclicking (this is a poke command) and Smartkey II turns it off. A minor point: While you can exit from Auto-Aid using Esc...X, if you have a large program to run, say an adventure that is 24K long, you'll have to reset and reboot.

The price of \$29.95 includes shipping, and FutureVision (617/663-8591) will accept either check or credit card. The owner, Steve, will help you with any questions and is a gentleman besides.

SmartTYPE justifies both center and right, but it is slow working. It will not justify an already edited SmartWriter document.

Re: mailing labels from SmartFILER

For about a year I have been using SmartFILER to maintain records and produce mailing labels. The system I use is a bit crude, but it functions satisfactorily and I haven't had to buy an additional filing program. My file records have numerous other fields besides the standard address info. SmartFILER has trouble producing a standard address label because of the 1/2 line spacing error created after each record. I purchased a box of AVERY #5360 copier labels 1 7/16 by 2 13/16. I print the mailing list on fanfold paper using this format:

return return return [first name] [last name] [address] [city], [state] [zip code]

The format is produced and stored in SmartWRITER using 1 and 26 margins. I cut the long printout vertically as wide as the printing and then cut the records into groups of seven. These strips are rubber cemented onto blank paper, and this master is photocopied onto the label stock, producing 21 labels per sheet. It is a bit time consuming to do the cut and paste and you need a copier handy, but the oversize labels allow for adjustment of the 1/2 line spacing errors.

Now that I have a tractor feed, I purchased a box of AVERY #4146 labels. These are wider (4") and allow a print format with margins at 1 and 38. When printing labels in SmartFILER, the printer stops at every 6th or 7th label and assumes you are changing single sheet paper. This allows you to move the platen to adjust out the 1/2 line spacing error.

I said it was crude, but the alternative is to buy a new program and then type all of my database over again!! It took a little practice and waste to set this up, but I can produce 75 labels without any problem.

Although I have not done so in my last two letters to you, I think It's time I thanked you for delivering me from what I call "The Prison of Terms." For the first year of using my ADAM I was lost in a realm of computer terms, such as PEEK, POKE, CALL, Z-80, CP/M, and many more. My thanks extend across the miles to congratulate you on your wonderful newsletter.

I now have some information about pokes that I would like to share with you and your readers. The following pokes allow for commands to be entered so that you may return what had been poked to its normal value. I have set the pokes up in a table for easier reading.

NO.	POKE LOCATION	orig. Value	NEW VALUE
1.	17354	8	10
2.	17199	30	2-30
3.	1146	93	1-255
4.	17131	16	15
5.	17302	16	17
6.	17302	16	17

POKE #1 causes the cursor to change to CHR\$(255) and no longer flash.

POKE #2 indicates the values for the cut off value of the right side of the screen.

POKE #3 changes the prompt to any one of the ASCII character codes.

POKE #4 will inverse the cursor and a few of the letters typed.

POKE #5 is so hard to describe that I recommend you just give it a try.

POKE #6 will turn off both the Ctrl-P and Ctrl-O keys.

Note: All pokes must be followed by the text command and only pokes 2 and 3 may have varied values. If 1, 4, 5, or 6 has any different value than the ones stated, your system will "HANG UP" on you.

I have come up with two handy tricks that other AUGies might want to use with SmartWRITER.

If you have a complicated set of margin, line spacing and tab stop settings that you use a lot, just clear your workspace, set them up, put one space in (ADAM won't store a file with no characters in it) and store the file. When you want to use those settings, just get the file and there they are. This is especially handy if you have a disk drive.

To move a file from the backup directory to the main directory, just copy it into your work space (GET), and STORE it right into the main directory. ADAM automatically deletes the file from the backup directory.

If you use sound (tone or noise generators) in your programs, make a HELLO file on SmartBASIC tape to enter this machine language routine:

- 10 DATA 58, 38, 4, 211, 255, 201
- 20 FOR x=1056 to 1061: READ ml:POKE x,ml NEXT

This puts the routine into an area unused by SmartBASIC, where it will remain even if you type NEW or LOAD another program. (Basic Utility). Then all you need in your program(s) or in the immediate mode to access sound is as follows:

POKE 1062, VOLUME (high):CALL 1056 POKE 1062, sound (tone or noise):CALL 1056 FOR i=1 to 100 (time delay):NEXT POKE 1062, Volume(low-off):CALL 1056

Write and tell me what values you use in the pokes. I live in the deep country with the mosquitoes, and don't know anyone else who has an ADAM computer.



I have found a command to use In SmartBASIC that will keep people from breaking out of a program by using Ctrl-C. The command is NOBREAK and is used in the program before a point at which you don't want a person to break out. To cancel the NOBREAK command, use BREAK and you will be able to break out using Ctrl-C.

The program below uses the NOBREAK command as an example.

10 TEXT
20 NOBREAK
30 PRINT "I bet you can't break out!"
40 FOR a = 1 to 3000:next a
50 BREAK
60 PRINT "Try it now!"
70 GOTO 70

I have also found some other commands that I have not yet been able to use. They are SHLOAD, RECALL, and IN#. If someone finds out how to use these, please write.

Some of the products I am interested in are the SP-1 Interface, an ADAM disk drive, and any product that would allow me to connect my system to an RGB monitor.

I am having a problem with one of my disk drives and I'm hoping that someone has some helpful hints or solutions. Anytime I try to write on a disk, for example, save, delete, initialize, etc., I receive an I/O error or file not found message. Obviously, I've checked for a write tab or a locked file. The disk drive will read the file fine. I tried cleaning the heads and also lubed the roll bar that the heads travel back and forth on. This helped temporarily, but the problem returned. I lubed the bar with the same dry lube that Coleco recommends for use on the printer.

I called Coleco about the problem and they suggested that since it is no longer under warranty, I can return it to them with \$160.00 and they would replace it.

If anyone has a solution or a suggestion to check out, please help.



I would like to comment on the letter from Randy Friesen in Vol. 1, No. 6.

He indicated that if a disk is initialized using SmartBASIC, a CATALOG of that disk will display 253K of free storage space. The disk will still contain 158K free, and I/O errors will be experienced if blocks above 160 are accessed for a read or write. SmartBASIC initializes the disk as though it were a data pack which writes 255 in the "VOLUME" and "BLOCKS LEFT" directory entries. The BOOT loader and directory each require one block, which explains the 253K displayed as free space by the CATALOG. This is one of several items that is corrected when BACKUP+ fixes SmartBASIC for disk operation.

Remember, INIT only initializes the directory block(s) and doesn't alter the formatting of a data pack or disk.

Video Output Control

The following POKES can add professional appeal to your own projects and can even enhance some commercial software. First, note the color codes (0-15) In the July-August AUGment. Next, let's explain my variable names:


bs = background color il = inverse letters nl = normal letters	gw = graphics window is = inverse screen ns=normal screen
TEXT mode POKES: POKE 17059,bs POKE 17115,nl*16+ns POKE 17126,il*16+is	(default = 0) (default = 240) (default = 15)
GR mode POKES: POKE 18607,bs POKE 18633,gw*16+gw POKE 18711 ,nl*16+ns	(default = 1) (default = 17) (default = 240)
HGR mode POKES: POKE 25431,bs POKE 25471,gw*16+gw POKE 25568,nl*16+ns	(default = 1) (default = 17) (default = 240)

None of these POKEs affects the other modes, so you can have color in all three. To implement the color change, just type the corresponding mode command (TEXT, GR, or HGR) and press <RETURN>. Note that "0" Is transparent; it is not "black." Also, PUSH, in the TEXT mode, is the result of alternating between NORMAL and INVERSE colors. Finally, the HGR POKES will work In HGR2 with the exception of the text window.

You can change the prompt, cursor or HOME blank space character by poking the new ASCII value Into addresses 1146, 16953 and 16954, respectively.

You can use any of the 16 colors In HGR mode, poking the color code Into address 16777. Also, you can reset the current device by poking the new value Into 16641 (d1=8, d2=24, d3=4, and d4=5). Finally, you can increase the graphics text window to 8 lines with POKE 16958,16 and POKE 16993,8 and POKE 16995,16 and then typing HOME. (Changing modes will reset these addresses to their default values.)

The last time we met, we used the DIR program in CP/M to see all the files on a disk. We saw STAT.COM and COPY.COM but we didn't see DIR. HOW COME!!!??? Well, it seems there are some programs that live with CP/M and they are called resident programs. The programs that you DO see listed are called transient programs. That means that they can be moved to another disk, but you can only move resident programs by sysgening a disk (SYSGEN.COM). Let's try another resident program called TYPE.

At the A> prompt type TYPE EXAMPLE.TXT and <return>. That's right. You're now looking at a program called EXAMPLE.TXT. Does that mean you can see all your files on the screen? Well, not exactly. Try typing TYPE COPY.COM <return> at the A> prompt. What's happened to all the good stuff we had before? This looks like "garbage." It is! The only readable files are written in "English." Those files are called "ASCII" files. COPY .COM is not written in ASCII; it is written in machine language.

Now, let's make use of the TYPE program. First make sure your printer is on line and paper is aligned. At the A> prompt hit Ctrl-P (this toggles the printer ON) and then type TYPE EXAMPLE.TXT <return>. Your printer should have printed exactly what you see on the screen (including the words TYPE EXAMPLE.TXT). When you finish, make sure that you hit Ctrl-P again. That toggles the printer OFF. You can use this method to get "hard copy" directly from your disk by using our friendly CP/M power.

Try this one on your own. Use the Ctrl-P (ON) and type DIR <return>. There's something you can use!

In our next newsletter, we will discuss a powerful transient program called PIP.COM and why it is probably the most widely used program when working with files and making back-ups.

Assembler

This program can create four different types of visual displays: PIE charts, vertical BAR graphs, LINE graphs, and STEP graphs. Horizontal BAR graphs may be printed on the printer.

The Chart & Graphic Assembler allows you to switch between each of the various types of graphs without re-entering the data.

The graphs are displayed in high-resolution (including text) using various colors. Up to ten sixdigit values may be graphed.

Some types of information may display on one chart or graph better than on another. For this reason the program allows you to change from one type to another using the same data.

Charts and Graphs Assembler is very useful as it allows you to quickly visualize the relationship between several numbers or quantities. You can use the graphs to review sales and profit performance, inventories of various items, show the change in volume at several different time periods, and many other applications.

This is a very simple program to operate. SmartBASIC must be loaded first, then insert the Data pack/disk that contains the Chart & Graph Assembler and enter RUN CGA, then press RETURN.

The documentation is very easy to understand and is presented very well. The step by step instructions make it simple to get into the program quickly.

I found this program very interesting and handy to use. It is fast and reliable and it is worth the money. It can be useful in Business, Education and even for home use.

Crosstalk XVI

Crosstalk XVI is a fabulous communications program, a lot better than ADAMLink I or II or any public domain MODEM7 program.

Crosstalk can handle modem speeds up to 9600 baud. The ADAMLink modem is a 300 baud modem and the fastest modem available works at a speed of 2400 baud. It can be used with the ADAMLink modem and has many features that the Link software doesn't.

The program allows you to use a menu format or a command format. The menu option is useful to beginners, but the more experienced user probably will want to use the command feature because it is faster. It allows you to use "script files" (also known as "macros") which are real time savers. With the macros, you can load a file which tells your modem whet to do. For instance, you can load a program that calls your local Telenet number, logs on to CompuServe, gives CompuServe your user name, ID number and password, goes to E-Mail, checks your mailbox, downloads your mail, and signs off. You can put up to 17 commands in one script-file. I use it to call my local Telenet, log on to CompuServe, give my user name, ID, and password. This saves a lot of time and doesn't get me disconnected if I make a mistake in logging on. Crosstalk has a much larger buffer than the 8k on the ADAMLink software, and after the buffer is full, it will automatically save it to disk. Crosstalk uses the standard XMODEM protocol. This makes sure that the information you have uploaded or downloaded is sent correctly, 128 blocks at a time. If the information has not been transferred right, it will transfer it again until it is transferred right.

Crosstalk comes with a 182 page manual with tutorials. For any serious modem user, it is a must.

Copycart+

COPYCART+ is a copy utility program from MMSG designed to copy Colecovision compatible ROM cartridges to disks or data packs. This makes it possible to load various programs without powering down ADAM to switch the cartridges.

The program is written in machine language and is self booting, loading in only 10 seconds from disk. After the title screen appears, remove the disk or data pack and press RETURN for the MAIN MENU.

The three functions of COPYCART+ are:

1: CREATE TARGET MEDIA—used to make formatted disks or data packs self-booting and ready to store cartridge programs. This process takes about 12 seconds for a disk and uses 4K of space.

2: COPY A CARTRIDGE—used to copy the contents or a ROM cartridge to a disk or data pack. On disks there is 154K available for cartridge programs. That's about 9 cartridges on one disk. Data packs will have 249K available. That's 15 or more cartridges each. Copying is fast. Also, a 24K cartridge takes only 30 seconds.

3: DELETE A FILE—used to remove a program from a disk or data pack.

Once the program is saved to the TARGET media, it is loaded in the same manner as SmartBASIC, Smart LOGO or ADAMCALC. Place it in the drive and pull the Computer Reset. The title screen appears in seconds, followed by a catalog of stored programs. The programs are selected by number. Loading is fast too: 15 seconds for a 24K cartridge.

COPYCART+ supports both disk and tape systems and is self-prompting with English error messages. The manual is well written and easy to understand.

Bob's Business

Continuing from the last issue, we will enter more inputs into our "Fundamental Analysis" program and analyze the results. The inputs this month are: NOTE: enter the inputs from the last issue through "Earnings per share, bottom line, last year."

"Accounts Receivable, this year" 122901 [same source)---"Accounts Receivable, last year" 106681 (same source)

"Inventories, this year" 109961 (same source)---"Inventories, last year" 139114 (same source)

"Quick assets, this year" 134030 (add cash + accounts receivable)---"Quick assets, last year" 109199 (same source)

"Current assets, this year" 254913 (source: Balance Sheet, Assets)---"Current Assets, last year" 254982 (same source)

"Noncurrent Assets, this year" 112500 (same source)---"Noncurrent Assets, last year" 140010 (same source)

"Intangible Assets, this year" .000001 (same source)---"Intangible Assets, last year" .000001 (same source)

"Total Assets, this year" 376201 (same source)---"Total Assets, last year" 404009 (same source)

"Current Liabilities, this year" 140540 (source: Balance Sheet, Liabilities)---"Current Liabilities, last year" 150248 (same source)

"Long-term debt, this year" 116777 (same source)---"Long-term debt, last year" 123623 (same source)

"Other long-term liabilities, this year" 8800 (same source)---"Other long-term liabilities, last year" 10119 (same source)

"Total liabilities, this year" 266140 (same source) --- "Total liabilities, last year" 283998 (same source). For all other items from this point on: enter 1 for the first input, 2 for the second, 3 for the third.... Do not repeat an input.

The ratios in the output that are meaningful at this point, in addition to those described last month, are: Current Ratio, Quick Ratio, Liquidity Ratio. All three of these ratios measure short term debt paying ability, solvency and liquidity.

The current ratio measures how many times the company could pay off its current liabilities in one year; the quick ratio measures how many times the company could pay off its current liabilities in about a week; the liquidity ratio measures how many times the company could pay its current liabilities overnight. The rule of thumb is that a current ratio greater than 2.0 is safe and a quick ratio greater than 1.0 is safe. Note that DiGiorgio is right on the borderline, but its debt paying ability is improving.

The Debt Ratio and the Equity Ratio measure how the company is financed—through stock sales end retained earnings (equity) or loans and bonds (debt). The indication of "good or bad" for these ratios will be discussed next issue when we measure leverage.

The accounts receivable turnover measures how quickly the company is collecting its bills. To make it meaningful, divide the turnover into 365 days. DiGiorgio would thus have 365 days/9.045 = 40.4 days. This tells you it takes the company 40 days to collect a bill. Watch for trends in this number over the years—if the "days" starts rising, the company is having trouble collecting.

The inventory turnover measures how long it takes to sell inventory. Again, divide it into 365 days. This year, we arrive at 49.3 days. This says that it takes 49 days to sell inventory on average. Again, a rising trend (the days to sell are increasing) is quite bad, and a falling trend is good.

In Response.

...When working with disks, it is always a good idea to have blank formatted ones handy at all times. If you should have to move files because your present disk is full, you will have a formatted one ready. In order to solve this problem, it is a good idea to format the entire box of new disks and replace them in their sleeves BACKWARDS to indicate that they have been formatted.

...In the last issue (Vol 2, No.1), the review of CONVERT, the first paragraph states that this program "allows you to copy non-CP/M disks to ADAM format." It should read "allows you to copy other NON-ADAM CP/M disks to ADAM CP/M format."

...When using ADAM Link to communicate with CompuServe or any other commercial on-line service, make sure that you re-dial and properly "log off" if you are accidentally disconnected. If you don't, you will be charged an additional fifteen minutes connect time.

...According to the Postal Service, the AUGment can take from 3 days to 3 weeks to be delivered. If your friend or neighbor gets it before you do, have patience; yours will be coming soon.

... The AUGment is printed using SELECT Word Processor on a Kaypro computer interfaced (connected) to a NEC Spinwriter printer. The typeface (thimble) is Prestige Renown with a slight modification to the letter "I." The disks are Nashua. The modem we use is the Hayes Smartmodem (300-1200 baud) and, of course, the ADAMLink (300 baud.)
