Here is a nice little routine to take care of rounding and aligning decimals. I hope someone will find it useful.

- 10 z=(any value):z = z +.005:a=INT(z)

Line 10 is any value for demonstration — z=z+.005 rounds up the decimal. In line 40 b=LEFT\$(b\$,3) sets decimal at 2 places plus decimal point. Line 50 will print when there is no decimal value. Line 60 will add a zero if the decimal value is only one place (i.e., .1). Line 70 concatenates the strings into one value. Line 80 pads zeros at the front of the string to align all decimals. (In this case, the string will be 13 characters long.) Line 90 returns a number value to q\$.

Dear AUG,

Recently, I bought the **ADAMCalc** program and I have some problems for which I can not find the solution. Perhaps you can help me out.

The first is that, although it worked all right at first, now I get a ": needed" error message when I try to sum or average a number of cells, in spite of the fact that the colon in fact is not missing at all.

The second is that I can not find in the manual a way to add a value to a cell which already has a value without at the same time replacing the value which is already there. What I want to do is the following: Every week we sell the produce we grow in our greenhouses to a number of customers. In the first place, I want the weekly sales of the various types of produce and the various customers in one part of the spreadsheet resulting in weekly totals per type of produce and per customer. But I also want these weekly figures added automatically in another part of the spreadsheet, giving me the results as they are accumulating during the year. It seems I am not able to accomplish this.

Dear AUG,

Here is a useful filing system. Use a **BASIC** cassette and type in lines 10 to 210 as you would any new program. Then, starting at Line 220, type in the data you wish to file. I have entered books, authors and types, but you can use other information, such as records, tapes, and addresses. However, they must be entered exactly as you would later refer to them. Spelling, capitals and abbreviations must be the same. You must enter the data in groups of threes, with a comma between each reference. It is not essential, but for clarity it is best to enter data in the same order, for example, title, author, type.

To use the sytem after entering data, enter "run." You will be given a choice of 1 reference or 2. If you choose "1" reference, enter 1 choice, for example, mystery. You will be given a list of all mysteries filed. Enter "Dick Francis" to get a list of all books by Dick Francis. If you choose "2" references, enter two factors, such as "John Smith" and "history." If there is nothing in the file, or you have entered incorrect information, the answer will be "NOT HERE."

To delete data, simply type in that line number and push RETURN. To add data, use the next empty line and type in "DATA" and information. To end a running program, push CTRL-C and RETURN.

You must give your filing system a name as you would any program to "save" it. After you have added or deleted data, changes must be recorded on your data pack. I do this by deleting the old program and saving the new one. Using the name "filer," do the following routine:

List-Return-delete filer-Return-(Wait to clear)-Load filer-Return

This is a "bare bones" system and can be easily changed to meet your needs.

DISK DRIVE REPAIR:

If your disk drive is out of warranty, this may save you the cost of a repair. If it is still in warranty, you might be better off to take it to Honeywell, because working on it yourself could void the warranty.

If your disk drive stops working, the screw holding the main drive pulley inside may have worked loose. To check this, carefully rotate the center hub of a disk until the small hole is visible near the hub. Now, put this disk in your drive and close the door.

After the drive stops whirring, remove the disk to see if the hole is still visible. If it is, your disk is not rotating as it should, possibly due to a loose screw. This is fairly easy to fix if you are handy with a Phillips screwdriver.

Here's how to do it:

1. Turn off the power and disconnect the cables.

2. Turn the drive over and remove the six small 'screws, including the ones holding the rubber feet. Remove the two plastic pieces (the lower case) and set them aside.

3. Remove the four screws holding the top of the case; set the case aside.

4. Remove the two screws holding the front panel and set it aside also.

5. Now remove the four screws (two on each side) that hold the drive mechanism to the black metal frame.

6. CAREFULLY lift up the front of the mechanism, tilting it back to gain access to the large pulley underneath. Tighten the screw that holds the pulley to the shaft if it is loose.

7. Re-assemble by replacing all the screws in reverse order.

Screen Chop Review

Screen Chop is a fantastic CP/M utility that eliminates the need for horizontal scrolling. The program chops data that is coming on the screen in long lines and displays shorter lines.

Screen Chop loads under CP/M. When it loads, the default width and paging options are on.

The ADAM Delete Key turns the program on and off. With the ADAM's UNDO key, the page option is turned off or on. When the paging option is on, the display is HALTED after the first 22 lines are displayed. The word HALTED will appear on the bottom. At the end of each line a hyphen (-) will appear.

Pressing the RETURN key allows the next 22 lines to be displayed, and pressing the space bar allows the next five lines to be displayed.

This program allows you to run many CP/M programs for the ADAM. The data may look a little strange to read, but it is better than scrolling horizontally.

SQUEEZE+ REVIEW

SQUEEZE+ is a great all purpose utility program that will solve the biggest problem of the ADAM system. Whenever you edit a program or file, ADAM creates a new file and never really deletes the old one. You can get only 158K on disk and 243K on tape, and when these limits are reached the tape/disk is full.

Now there is SQUEEZE+, which will allow you to recover wasted space. It squeezes your files to the front of the tape or disk. It sorts the files into saved and backup/deleted files. It gives you the ability to save backup and deleted files, or to delete saved files. It then squeezes the files you have chosen to save onto the same tape/disk, or onto another tape or disk.

SQUEEZE+ will squeeze on the same tape or disk. It frees up directory and tape/disk space. Besides squeezing files, it also copies any tape to another tape or any disk to another disk. In addition, SQUEEZE+ can copy from tape to disk and disk to tape. It has the ability to recover backup or deleted files. It is able to make backup copies of **SmartBASIC**, **SmartLOGO**, games, etc.

Desk Master

Desk Master, from Nickelodeon Graphics, 5640 W. Brown, Glendale, AZ 85303, consists of three Desk Sets:

B-Desk has: client list, card file, address list, phone list, record of sales, purchases, data log. You can have up to 140 records, nine fields, 115 characters per field, 3,300 individual records per DDP. You can do speed searches, alphabetical listings, printouts, adjust margins and spacing, mail list, multiple labels, change or add data to file, save, recover data, automatic readout of memory remaining, file numbers.

M-Desk lets you track expenses and income. It includes pre-formatted categories, and you can save or recover data, print out your data, summarized as a statistical readout of income, outgo, averages, percent per item, record of expenses such as phone bills, electric, auto. M-Desk allows input of three sentences per category, computes data related to expenses, prints out sum, averages, increases of expenses. Summary reports print out analysis of the data related to income and expenses, search, change data to individual files, memory remaining readout, catalog within program.

F-Desk lets you create your own customer file, make and keep your information as you like, or you can use it as a scratch pad for a book report. It also has a statistics function where you can enter dollar amounts, speeds, temperatures, etc. The program automatically calculates sum, averages, and totals, and it allows comparisons between any variables you like.

All of these programs are menu driven. Each has a different screen and its own color. Using Smart Keys makes it easier to enter data. You will have to spend some time learning the programs, as each one has many options. You can go from one Desk to another (save information first) without rebooting **BASIC**.

In Response...

...Saving **Smart BASIC** programs onto disk is very simple. Type SAVE "filename",d5 or 6 if you have a second disk drive, and then press RETURN. To make sure the program did save, type CATALOG.

...If you wear glasses and find that your eyes tire after a session in front of the computer screen, ask your optician or optometrist to prescribe glasses for a distance of 15" or so, the distance between your eyes and the screen.

...Keep your drive doors open when the computer is not in use. This avoids pressure on the drive heads.

...Canadian members might be interested to know that money orders are \$5 to \$8 cheaper than most checques, when sending \$ to the U.S.

...PEEKS and POKES are different on the ADAM and Apple computers.

...There is no schematic or memory map available for the ADAM at this time.

...We at the ADAM USERS' GROUP do not sell any hardware or software for the ADAM computer.

...Syntax Errors means that you've mistyped something in a program line. A message is printed and a little arrowhead points to the position at which the computer didn't understand what you did. An example of this is the Illegal Command.

...I/O Errors occur when we try to use the data pack/disk drive unit or the printer.

The type of error often must be deduced from an I/O error message, because those messages cover the complex interactions between the computer and attached peripherals. An example of this is the End of Data.

Keyboard Replacement

Here is an interesting finding that may be useful to some ADAM owners.

While shopping at Radio Shack for some coaxial cable, I noticed that they carried replacement keyboards for computers — not just any keyboard, but the ADAM keyboard. It seems that Tandy (Radio Shack) has purchased from Coleco the keyboards that never got into the completed product when they stopped making ADAM.

This was a great find for me, since I had a dead #1 SmartKey and the keyboard at Radio Shack cost only \$5.95. I bought one immediately. The keyboard is fully assembled and interfaces with the housing by means of a 21 pin ribbon cable. I know nothing about electronics and it only took me 10 minutes to replace my keyboard.

First, turn your keyboard upside down and prop it up on two small pieces of wood so that the keys will not be depressed. Then, remove the six small screws that hold the housing together. The keyboard module is held in by four screws, two on each end of the keyboard. Remove these. Now the keyboard module is free of the housing except for the ribbon interface, which goes into a metal box attached to the bottom of the board. This metal box, which is wired to the ADAM net keyboard plug, has to be removed and put on the new keyboard.

This metal box is held on the old keyboard by four studs with two nuts on two of the studs and two clips which are part of the box itself. Once you have removed the nuts and freed the clips, the box and circuit board will be free, except for the ribbon cable. This cable should be removed carefully so that you do not damage the circuit board. Remember which way this ribbon was inserted into the interface on the board so that you can replace the new one the same way.

The four studs that held the metal box and circuit board to the bottom of the module can be removed and transferred to the new keyboard with a very small wrench. Make sure you put them in the same holes on the new keyboard. Insert the new keyboard ribbon cable into the interface on the circuit board carefully, not forcing it, until it slides in. Now, you are ready to attach the box and circuit board onto the new keyboard. there are small plastic spacer sleeves that were on the studs when you removed the metal box. Replace them on the studs and fit the box onto the studs. Once it is positioned, the studs will come through the holes. Replace the nuts onto the two studs, and make sure the clips are holding tight on the other two studs. Replace the whole keyboard module into the housing with the four screws, and then close it up with the six you took out earlier. YOU ARE DONE!

This may seem complicated, but it isn't, as you will see during the procedure. If you are familiar with electronics work, the replacement will be a piece of cake. If you have any dead keys, the replacement is a must and it costs only \$5.95!!

Basic Practice

The following program demonstrates a simple bubble sort routine. You may find several different uses for it. As it is designed, it will alphabetically sort as many items as you want. Bubble sorts are rather slow, but easy to understand and type in.

Line 10 sets the normal and inverse screen colors. Line 20 enters the colors with the TEXT command (one of the most powerful BASIC commands) and positions the cursor. Line 30 displays a title header. Line 40 assigns the number to sort to the "num%" variable. **BASIC** recognizes only the first two letters of a variable name; ADAM would consider num, nub and nux as the same variable. A dollar sign (\$) at the end of the variable name means that it may be assigned non-numeric values (symbols, letters, etc.) A percent sign (%) at the end of a variable name means that it can store only integers (non-decimal numbers). These integer variables use half as much memory as the common floating point variables but are limited to values greater than -32767 and less than 32767 inclusive.

Lines 50 through 90 assign your entries to the DIMensioned "sort\$" variables. Lines 100 through 130 contain the logic of the sort. This routine compares remaining unsorted variables in a loop until the lowest value string (word variable) is located. You may change the greater than sign (>) in line 120 to a less than sign (<) to achieve a reverse alphabetical sort. You should note that ADAM sorts by ASCII values so that in an alphabetical sort numbers precede letters and upper case precedes lower case. Line 140 prints the sorted list.

ASCII code: (American Standard Code for Information Interchange) assigns a specific number to each letter of the alphabet, each symbol, each control function, etc. ADAM supports 256 ASCII values. The first 128 of these are listed on pages C-12 to C-15 of the user's guide that came with ADAM.

FONT: This term refers to the specific design of a character. In BASIC TEXT mode ADAM supports 256 individually defined fonts — each one corresponding to a particular ASCII value. In the BASIC graphics mode ADAM supports 96 individually defined fonts in the text window. These shape definitions are stored within the 16K video chip. With machine language routines you can change the characters to your design preferences.

SPRITE: A sprite is a user-designed pattern. Sprites permit smooth animation. All super-game packs use sprites. ADAM supports 32 individually definable sprites. Sprites may be used in TEXT, HGR, and GR modes. They overlay text and other graphics designs. Machine language routines are necessary to create, display, and animate sprites. The video chip must be accessed to control sprites.

CP/M Stuff

So far we have discussed "transient" programs called STAT.COM and PIP.COM and "resident" programs called DIR and TYPE. This issue we will call upon two more "resident" programs. The first is REN and the second is ERA. REN RENames a file and ERA ERAses a file.

With your CP/M disk/data pack in drive A, let's REName a file.

First type DIR to get a DIRectory of all on the disk/dp. There's a file STAT.COM. (What is it?) It is a program that returns information about files, drives and other peripheral devices. So...we will now rename STAT.COM to INFO.COM.

At the A> prompt type REN INFO.COM = STAT.COM <retum>.

When the A> appears again, type DIR.

STAT.COM is no longer there. It has been RENamed INFO.COM. Remember...as with PIP the new filename is typed FIRST and the old filename is typed LAST. Try typing it in reverse. (Yes, the file does exist.) When RENaming .COM files you must use the .COM extension on both or the program will not run. Try it. You can always change it back again.

REN is used when you have to edit a document using a different file name and then would like to ERAse the old file and rename the new.

Speaking of ERAsing, the ERA program is not to be taken casually. In order to try this program put an OLD document disk/dp in drive B. Make sure that everything on it is either backed-up or is unimportant.

Now type B:DIR. Pick a file that you don't mind losing FOREVER.

Type B:ERA filename.ext <return>.

You must use the extension or ERA will not understand which file you want ERAsed.

It is also VERY important to use the drive name (A: or B:) or you may ERAse a file with the same name on the wrong disk/dp.

In the next issue of AUGment we will discuss the use of "wild cards" and how a little asterisk can go a long way in saving time and keystrokes.

Bob's Business

So, we are finally getting to the end of our DiGiorgio analysis, with the following ratios:

Return on assets: 6.073% (this year) and 6.176% (last year).

This measures the return DiGiorgio could earn on each dollar of assets it owns; the higher this ratio is, the better. An analogy for this ratio would be your personal residence; the percentage increase in its value over a 12 month period would be your return on that asset. This ratio is calculated BEFORE interest expense and tax expense is subtracted from earnings for the year.

Return on Equity: 5.393% (this year) and 7.434% (last year).

This ratio measures what DiGiorgio earned on each dollar an investor entrusted with the company when that investor either bought the company's stock or let DiGiorgio keep some of its earnings (versus the investor receiving those earnings as dividends). This ratio is very important for two reasons: (1) many investors try to find a company whose Price Earnings ratio is substantially less than its return on equity percentage; (2) the return on equity should be compared with the return on assets — if the return on equity is significantly more than the return on assets, this is good because it means that the assets earn more than the company pays for its debt.

An analogy is again your house — if its value rises at 12% and you have a fixed mortgage at, say, 9%, your return on equity will be very good indeed.

COMMENT: DiGiorgio's returns do not look too good here since an investor can easily earn better than the 5.39% to 7.43% DiGiorgio can earn as a company. However, remember that this is only one ratio and 1986 might get better.

Fixed Assets as a % Long term Debt: 96.33% (this year) and 113.3% (last year).

This ratio measures how much of a claim the longterm debtors have against the fixed assets of the company. DiGiorgio has quite a bit of debt relative to its fixed assets. This is not necessarily bad, but it does show that the company would have trouble if a few years of poor operations occurred. Working capital flow: this is a surrogate measure for cash flow. If it is positive, the company has cash generated from operations in excess of its purchases of plant and equipment plus its cash dividends paid. If this measure is negative, the company did not generate enough cash to pay its cash dividends and replace its plant and equipment. Notice that DiGiorgio is negative each year. This can't go on for too long, since cash is the "blood" of a business and you can't borrow it forever.

Helpful Hints

To make your **SmartBASIC** program self-loading, first you need to make a copy of **SmartBASIC** onto a disk or data pack. Once that is finished, load your program in BASIC and add these statements to it.

1 ONERR GO TO 10000

10000 CALL 64743 (Make sure that there isn't already a line 10000)

If your program is an infinite loop, that is all you have to add. When you use <CONTROL-C>, it will return to typewriter mode. If the program has an END statement in it, change it so it will GO TO 10000 (or whatever the line number is for the CALL statement).

Next, take your new copy of **SmartBASIC** and save your program on it under 'HELLO'. When it has saved, pull the COMPUTER RESET button. Now the program should load automatically and after ending, return to the Electronic Typewriter mode. This trick is a nice touch to any game or good program that you've written.

Turboload

Finally, it's here! **Turboload** by Strategic Software.

Turboload will change a **BASIC** program file into a new file version so that it will load into your ADAM at a greater rate of speed. You no longer have to wait around for a L-0-N-G-E-R period of time to load a **BASIC** progam. Your original program will not be damaged or changed in any way through this process. File Organizer and File Index are also included with **Turboload**.

File Organizer is a good tool to have handy. It will Load, Run, Lock, Unlock, Delete, Undelete, Change Volume Headings, Rename and Change background colors.

The one thing that really interested me was the fact that there was finally a way to change the Volume Heading without having to destroy all the files that have been saved. Before this you would have to initialize the data pack/disk and lose all your files and hard work. The Volume Heading is usually called "First Dir" on most blank data packs/disks.

However, I was disappointed when, after following the instructions step by step, NOTHING happened. I tried many times with different data packs and still the Volume Heading did not change.

In my opinion, the instruction booklet should be more precise, by adding a diagram of all the SmartKeys, instead of just mentioning which Smart Key to press. In this way, the person would be able to get a mental picture of which Smartkey is which. Otherwise, File Organizer works great.

File Index prints an alphabetized report of all your file names on a data pack or disk, their type, lengths and which volume they are in. Thus you just have to refer to the file index to see if a certain file is on that data pack/disk.
